

NO ALLIANCE BETWEEN LIGHT & DARKNESS

by Blessed Pope Pius IX

Though the children of this world be wiser than the children of light, their snares and their violence would undoubtedly have less success if a great number of those who call themselves Catholics did not extend a friendly hand to them. Yes, unfortunately, there are those who seem to want to walk in agreement with our enemies and try to build an alliance between light and darkness, an accord between justice and iniquity, by means of those so-called liberal Catholic doctrines, which, based on the most pernicious principles, adulate the civil power when it invades things spiritual and urge souls to respect or at least tolerate the most iniquitous laws, as if it had not been written absolutely that no one can serve two masters. They are certainly much more dangerous and more baneful than our declared enemies, not only because they second their efforts, perhaps without realizing it, but also because, by maintaining themselves at the very edge of condemned opinions, they take on an appearance of integrity and irreprehensible doctrine, beguiling the imprudent friends of conciliations and deceiving honest persons, who would revolt against a declared error. In this way, they divide the minds, rend the unity, and weaken the forces that should be assembled against the enemy.

Deo Gratias! We have begun to celebrate Public Sunday Masses again!

In order to make sure we are within the 100 person limit at each Mass, we will implement an online sign-up system (from SignUpGenius.com) to reserve your places at Masses (with priority given to our active parishioners).

Please follow these simple instructions to properly reserve your place at Mass:

1. Send an email address with your first and last name (head of household) to stpatrick@icksp.org and indicate whether you are a parishioner or not.
2. You will then receive an invitation email from SignUpGenius. Open the email and click the link to access the sign-up page.
3. Specify which Mass time you wish to attend AND indicate number of persons going. (eg. 4 slots = 4 people).

REGARDING THE SATURDAY VIGIL 4PM MASS

The continuing side-effects of the Covid-19 pandemic have thrown into sharp relief the importance of making the most of our resources, especially in terms of personnel. We are grateful to the archdiocesan clergy who have come to celebrate the Saturday evening Mass here at Saint Patrick Parish, in addition to their other priestly duties and responsibilities.

As pastor, I observe that we continue to experience sanitizing and contagion concerns. There is especially the concern with older priests that are in the vulnerable age group of contracting the virus and who may have other health concerns of their own. Furthermore, there is concern also for a very significant number of our Saturday Vigil worshippers who are in the same vulnerable age group. A number have also communicated to me their ongoing fears of returning to Holy Mass and congregating with people.

We keep in mind our Archbishop who has extended his dispensation to all Catholics from the obligation to assist at Holy Mass and who has asked that the sick and those in the vulnerable age group should stay at home.

Unfortunately, this is the current situation we now face in our particular church community, and so, as we now return to the public celebration of Mass, it is not possible to begin again the 4pm Saturday Vigil Mass.

I encourage then all our able parishioners to come worship at our other weekend Masses (Sunday Masses at 8:30am or 10:30am), which I am able to maintain during this time.

However, for our parishioners who prefer to worship on Saturday, please consult the following list of our local Waterbury parishes who offer the Vigil Mass. We are very sorry for this inconvenience as we re-open carefully our Parish once again, but this would be for the safety and health of our faithful as we continue to cope through this pandemic crisis.

HOW TO REPORT AN INCIDENT OF SEXUAL ABUSE TO THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD

If you have knowledge or suspect that a minor or vulnerable adult (an adult with an intellectual disability) has been sexually abused, in any manner, by personnel of the Archdiocese of Hartford, you are urged to report this information to:

In addition, you will be asked to follow up in writing with a detailed description of the facts involved in the incident. Specifics of this written report can be found in the Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Hartford Relating to Allegations of Sexual Misconduct Involving Minors and Vulnerable Adults. This document is also available online at www.archdioceseofhartford.org. The Archdiocese of Hartford will report any and all incidents to the proper civil authorities.

Mandated reporters in the State of Connecticut are required by law to report any incident of sexual abuse involving a minor or vulnerable adult. We encourage any Non-Mandated persons to report such incidents to the proper authorities as well. We support your right to do so.

Department of Social Services for the Elderly

Once a written report of an incident of sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult has been received, an investigation will be undertaken by, or on behalf of, the Archdiocese of Hartford.
