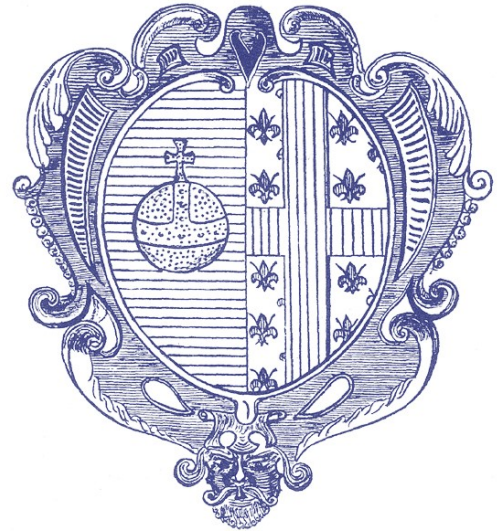

During Epiphany-tide in January is the opportunity to have your house blessed at the beginning of each new year.

At the Epiphany House Blessing, blessed chalk is used to inscribe the doors with Christ's blessings. Blessed Incense is burned in each room. Exorcized Holy Water is sprinkled throughout the house.

Please contact the Rector posthaste to schedule a House Visit with a list of preferred times and dates in January 2022. Due to its popularity, we apologize if your preferred time is not honored.

As you noticed, we no longer take up a basket collection during offertory time, in order to enhance the reverence of the Holy Liturgy.

2nd Wave of Requests

We are accepting Mass intentions (preferably without any specific date) for this year 2022. We are first asking for a limit of 6 intentions (only 2 of those can be requested on a Sunday) per family for now in order to accommodate everyone's requests & we will gradually accept more, if permitting. The rector has now fixed the suggested Mass stipend at \$10 for each intention (this stipend, or whichever the requestor gives, benefits the priest celebrating the Mass for his livelihood). In addition, Mass intention requests must now be accompanied with the stipend in order for the requests be actually reserved & scheduled in the Mass intention book.
