NINETEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Introit: I am the salvation of the people, saith the Lord: in whatever tribulation they shall cry to Me I will hear them; and I will be their Lord for ever. **Ps. 77, 1.** Attend, O My people, to My law; incline your ears to the words of My mouth. **V. Glory.**

Prayer: Almighty and merciful God, in Thy loving-kindness do Thou keep us from all things that war against us, that, being unhampered alike in soul and in body, we may with free minds perform the works that are Thine. Through our Lord.

Epistle: Eph. 4, 23-28. Brethren, Be ye renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the new man, who according to God is created in justice and holiness of truth. Wherefore, putting away lying, speak ye the truth every man with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. Be angry, and sin not. Let not the sun go down upon your anger. Give not place to the devil. He that stole, let him now steal no more; but rather let him labor, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have something to give to him that suffereth need.

Gradual: Ps. 140, 2. Let my prayer be directed as incense in Thy sight, O Lord. **V. The lifting up of my hands as evening sacrifice. Alleluia, alleluia. V. Ps. 104, 1.** Give glory to the Lord, and call upon His name: declare His deeds among the gentiles. Alleluia.

Gospel: Matt. 22, 2-14. At that time, Jesus spoke to the chief priests and the Pharisees in parables, saying, The kingdom of heaven is likened to a king, who made a marriage for his son; and he sent his servants, to call them that were invited to the marriage, and they would not come. Again he sent other servants, saying, Tell them that were invited, Behold, I have prepared my dinner; my beeves and fatlings are killed, and all things are ready; come ye to the marriage. But they neglected: and went their ways, one to his farm, and another to his merchandise; and the rest laid hands on his servants, and having treated them contumeliously, put them to death. But when the king had heard of it, he was angry; and sending his armies, he destroyed those murderers, and burnt their city. Then he saith to his servants, The marriage indeed is ready, but they that were invited were not worthy. Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as you shall find, call to the marriage. And his servants going forth into the ways, gathered together all that they found, both bad and good; and the

The EMBER DAYS of September.

The Ember days represent an ancient and cherished tradition of the Roman Church. Four times a year, at the change of seasons, three days of the week – Wednesday, Friday and Saturday – were devoted to prayer and fasting to implore God’s blessing on the new season and the ordinations which took place during the vigil held on the Saturday-Sunday night.

The September Ember days, as well as days of fasting and penance, are also a period of joy. To the Jews they recalled the twofold promulgation of the Law, on their exodus from Egypt and after the Babylonian captivity. They recall to Christians God’s constant protection over His people and their own deliverance. Thanksgiving for the year’s harvest is joined to God’s benefits in the past.

The penitential fast which the Church imposes on us at Embertide implies a sincere conversion, and that real return to God which the prophet Osee required of the Jews (Friday’s Epistle) and which bestows with the friendship of God the joy of living in His presence (Epistle and Introit). The Gospel of that same day shows the extent of God’s pardon; there is no pardon like God’s.

The Ember Saturday recalls a twofold festival of penance and rejoicing which the Jews kept at this season. The commemoration of these former festivals is more than a mere memorial. It is an acknowledgement of God’s protection and mercy towards His people. In the High Priest going into the Holy of Holies St. Paul sees the type of Christ, the High Priest of the new Law entering heaven with His own Blood, having won for us everlasting redemption.

Secret: Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that these gifts, which we offer up in the sight of Thy majesty, may be salutary unto us. Through our Lord.

Communion.: Ps. 118,4,5. Thou hast commanded Thy commandments to be kept most diligently: O that my ways may be directed to keep Thy justifications.

Postcommunion: Let Thy healing power, O Lord, in mercy deliver us from our waywardness and cause us ever to cleave to Thy commandments. Through our Lord.
