RESUMED 4TH SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY

Introit: Jer. 29, 11, 12, 14. The Lord saith, I think thoughts of peace, and not of affliction; you shall call upon Me and I will hear you; and I will bring back your captivity from all places. **Ps. 84, 2.** Lord, Thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob. *V.* Glory.

Prayer: O God, Who knowest that we are beset by perils so great as to be unendurable because of our human frailty, grant us health of mind and body, so that by Thine assistance we may conquer the things with which we are afflicted because of our sins. Through our Lord.

Epistle: Romans 13: 8-10. Brethren, owe no man any thing, but to love one another; for he that loveth his neighbor hath fulfilled the law. For thou shalt not commit adultery, thou shalt not kill, thou shalt not steal, thou shalt not bear false witness, thou shalt not covet, and if there be any other commandment, it is comprised in this word, thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. The love of our neighbor worketh no evil. Love, therefore, is the fulfilling of the law.

Gradual: Ps. 43, 8, 9. Thou hast delivered us, O Lord, from them that afflict us: and hast put them to shame that hate us. *V.* In God we will glory all the day; and in Thy name we will give praise for ever. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* **Ps. 129, 1, 2.** From the Depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my prayer. Alleluia.

Gospel: Matt. 8: 23-27. At that time, when Jesus entered into the ship, His disciples followed Him. And behold a great tempest arose in the sea, so that the ship was covered with waves, but He was asleep. And they came to Him, and awaked Him, saying, Lord, save us, we perish. And Jesus saith to them, Why are ye fearful, O ye of little faith? Then rising up, He commanded the winds and the sea, and there came a great calm. But the men wondered, saying, What manner of man is this, for the winds and the sea obey Him?
