#### THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

**Introit: Ps. 96, 7. 8.** Adore God, all you His angels: Sion hears and is glad, and the cities of Juda rejoice. **Ps. 96, 1.** The Lord is King; let the earth rejoice; let the many isles be glad.

**Prayer:** Almighty and everlasting God, graciously look upon our infirmity, and, for our protection, stretch forth the right hand of Your Majesty.

**Epistle: Rom. 12, 16-21.** Be not wise in your own conceits. To no man render evil for evil, but provide good things not only in the sight of God, but also in the sight of all men. If it be possible, as far as in you lies, be at peace with all men. Do not avenge yourselves, beloved, but give place to the wrath, for it is written, "Vengeance is Mine: I will repay, says the Lord." But, "If your enemy is hungry, give him food; if he is thirsty, give him drink; for by so doing you will heap coals of fire upon his head." Be not overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

**Gradual: Ps. 101, 16. 17.** The nations shall revere Your name, O Lord, and all the kings of the earth Your glory. *V.* For the Lord has rebuilt Sion, and He shall appear in His glory. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* **Ps. 96, 1.** The Lord is King; let the earth rejoice; let the many isles be glad. Alleluia.

**Gospel: Matt. 8, 1-13.** At that time, when Jesus had come down from the mountain, great crowds followed Him. And behold, a leper came up and worshipped Him saying, "Lord, if You will, You can make me clean." And stretching forth His hand Jesus touched him, saying, "I will; be made clean." And immediately his leprosy was cleansed. And Jesus said to him, "See that you tell no one; but go, show yourself to the priest, and offer the gift that Moses commanded, for a witness to them." Now when He had entered Capharnaum, there came to Him a centurion who entreated Him, saying, "Lord, my servant is lying sick in the house, paralyzed, and is grievously afflicted." Jesus said to him, "I will come and cure him." But in answer the centurion said, "Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof; but only say the word, and my servant will be healed. For I too am a man subject to authority, and have soldiers subject to me; and I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it." And when Jesus heard this, He marvelled, and said to those who were following Him, "Amen I say to you, I have not found such great faith in Israel. And I tell you that many will come from the east and from the west, and will feast with Abraham and Isaac and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven, but the children of the kingdom will be put forth into the darkness outside; there will be the weeping, and the gnashing of teeth." Then Jesus said to the centurion, "Go your way; as you have believed, so be it done to you." And the servant was healed in that hour.

**Offertory: Ps. 117, 16. 17.** The right hand of the Lord has struck with power: the right hand of the Lord has exalted me; I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the Lord.

**Secret:** May this offering, we beseech You, O Lord, cleanse away our sins, and sanctify the bodies and minds of Your servants for the celebration of this sacrifice.

**Communion: Luke 4, 22.** All marvelled at the words that came from the mouth of God.

**Postcommunion:** We, O Lord, to whom You grant the use of mysteries so great, beseech You to render us truly fitted to obtain their effect.
