TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Ps. 129, 3, 4. If You, O Lord, mark iniquities, Lord, who can stand? But with You is forgiveness, O God of Israel. **Ps. 129, 1, 2.** Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord; Lord, hear my voice!

PRAYER: O God, our refuge and strength, the author of all piety, give ear to the devout prayers of Your Church; and grant that what we ask with faith, we may obtain effectually.

EPISTLE: Phil. 1, 6-11. Brethren: We are confident in the Lord Jesus that He Who has begun a good work in you will bring it to perfection until the day of Christ Jesus. And I have the right to feel so about you all, because I have you in my heart, all of you, alike in my chains and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel, as sharers in my joy. For God is my witness how I long for you all in the heart of Christ Jesus. And this I pray, that your charity may more and more abound in knowledge and all discernment, so that you may approve the better things, that you may be upright and without offense unto the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of justice, through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God.

GRADUAL: Ps. 132, 1-2. Behold how good it is, and how pleasant where brethren dwell as one! *V.* It is as when the precious ointment upon the head runs down over the beard, the beard of Aaron. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* **Ps. 113, 11.** Those who fear the Lord trust in the Lord; He is their help and their shield. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Matt. 22, 15-21. At that time, the Pharisees went and took counsel how they might trap Jesus in His talk. And they sent to Him their disciples with the Herodians, saying, "Master, we know that You are truthful, and that You teach the way of God in truth, and that You care naught for any man; for You do not regard the person of men. Tell us, therefore, what do You think: Is it lawful to give tribute to Cæsar, or not?" But Jesus, knowing their wickedness, said, "Why do you test Me, you hypocrites? Show Me the coin of the tribute." So they offered Him a denarius. And Jesus said to them, "Whose are this image and the inscription?" They said to Him, "Cæsar's." Then He said to them, "Render, therefore, to Cæsar the things that are Cæsar's, and to God the things that are God's."

OFFERTORY: Esther 14, 12, 13. Remember me, O Lord, You Who rule above all power: and give a well-ordered speech in my mouth, that my words may be pleasing in the sight of the prince.

SECRET: Grant, O merciful God, that this salutary oblation may forever free us from our faults, and shield us from all adversities.

COMMUNION: Ps. 16, 6. I call upon You, for You will answer me, O God; incline Your ear to me; hear my word.

POSTCOMMUNION: We have partaken, O Lord, of the gifts of this sacred mystery, and humbly beseech You, that what You have commanded us to do in remembrance of You may profit us as an aid to our weakness.

The beauty and culture of Rome are coming to Chicago for a special event celebrating the 20th anniversary of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest on Sunday, October 31, Feast of Christ the King, in the University of Chicago's Ida Noyes Hall at 5:00pm.
