FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

Introit: Apoc. 5, 12; 1, 6. Worthy is the Lamb Who was slain to receive power, and divinity, and wisdom, and strength, and honor. To Him belong glory and dominion forever and ever. **Ps. 71, 1.** O God, with Your judgment endow the King, and with Your justice, the King's son.

Prayer: Almighty and everlasting God, You have willed to restore all things in Your beloved Son, the King of the whole creation; mercifully grant that all the families of nations that have been disunited by the wound of sin may become subject to His most sweet dominion.

Epistle: Col. 1, 12-20. Brethren: We give thanks to God the Father Who has made us worthy to share the lot of the saints in light. He has rescued us from the power of darkness, and transferred us into the kingdom of His beloved Son, in Whom we have our redemption through His blood, the remission of our sins. He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature. For in Him were created all things in the heavens and on the earth, things visible and things invisible, whether Thrones, or Dominations, or Principalities, or Powers. All things have been created through and unto Him, and He is before all creatures, and in Him all things hold together. Again, He is the head of the body, the Church; He, Who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the first place. For it has pleased God the Father that in Him all His fullness should dwell, and that through Him He should reconcile to Himself all things, whether on the earth or in the heavens, making peace through the blood of His Cross, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Gradual: Ps. 71, 8. 11. He shall rule from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth. *V.* All kings shall pay Him homage, all nations shall serve Him. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* **Dan. 7, 14.** His power shall be an everlasting power which shall not be taken away: and His kingdom shall not be destroyed. Alleluia.

Tract: Ps. 88, 27. 28. 30. He shall say to Me, "You are My Father, My God, My Rock, My Savior." *V.* And I will make Him the first-born, highest of the kings of the earth. *V.* I will make His posterity endure forever and His throne as the days of heaven. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* **Dan. 7, 14.** His power is an everlasting power that shall not be taken away; and His kingdom shall not be destroyed. Alleluia. **V. Apoc. 19, 16.** He has on His garment, and on His thigh a name written, "King of kings, and Lord of lords." Alleluia.

Gospel: John 18, 33-37. At that time, Pilate said to Jesus, "Are You the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Do you say this of yourself, or have others told you of Me?" Pilate answered, "Am I a Jew? Your own people and the chief priests have delivered You to me. What have You done?" Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, My followers would certainly have fought that I might not be delivered to the Jews. But, as it is, My kingdom is not from here." Pilate therefore said to Him, "You are then a King?" Jesus answered, "You say it; I am a King. This is why I was born, and why I have come into the world, to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears My voice."

Offertory: Ps. 2, 8. Ask of Me and I will give You the nations for an inheritance and the ends of the earth for Your possession.

Secret: O Lord, we offer You the Victim of man's reconciliation; grant, we beseech You, that He Whom we immolate by these present sacrifices, may bestow on all nations, the gifts of unity and peace, Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord.

Communion: Ps. 28, 10.11. The Lord is enthroned as King forever; may the Lord bless His people with peace!

Postcommunion: Having received the food of immortality, we beseech You, O Lord, that we who glory in our warfare under the banners of Christ our King, may reign with Him forever in His heavenly dwelling place.

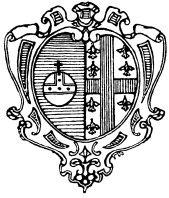

**ACT OF CONSECRATION OF THE HUMAN RACE

(By Pope Pius XI)**

Most sweet Jesus,
Redeemer of the human race,
look down upon us, humbly prostrate before Thine altar.

We are Thine and Thine we wish to be;
but to be more surely united with Thee,
behold each one of us freely consecrates himself today
to Thy Most Sacred Heart.

Many, indeed, have never known Thee;
many, too, despising Thy precepts,
have rejected Thee.

Have mercy on them all,
most merciful Jesus,
and draw them to Thy Sacred Heart.

Be Thou King, O Lord,
not only of the faithful who have never forsaken Thee,
but also of the prodigal children who have abandoned Thee,
grant that they may quickly return to their Father's house,
lest they die of wretchedness and hunger.

Be Thou King of those who are deceived by erroneous opinions,
or whom discord keeps aloof
and call them back to the harbour of truth and unity of faith,
so that soon there may be but one flock and one shepherd.

Be Thou King of all those who even now sit in the shadow of idolatry or
Islam, and refuse not Thou to bring them into the light of Thy kingdom.
Look, finally, with eyes of pity upon the children of that race,
which was for so long a time Thy chosen people;
and let Thy Blood, which was once invoked upon them in vengeance,
now descend upon them also in a cleansing flood of redemption and
eternal life.

Grant, O Lord, to Thy Church,
assurance of freedom and immunity from harm;
give peace and order to all nations,
and make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry:
*Praise to the Divine Heart that wrought our salvation:
to it be glory and honour forever.*
Amen.
