#### TWENTY FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**Introit: Jer. 29, 11. 12. 14.** The Lord says: "I think thoughts of peace, and not of affliction. You shall call upon Me, and I will hear you; and I will bring back your captivity from all places." **Ps. 84, 2.** You have favored, O Lord, Your land; You have restored the well-being of Jacob.

**Prayer:** Stir up, we beseech You, O Lord, the wills of Your faithful people; that more earnestly seeking after the fruit of good works, they may receive more abundant helps from Your mercy.

**Epistle: Col. 1, 9-14.** Brethren: We have been praying for you unceasingly, asking that you may be filled with knowledge of God's will, in all spiritual wisdom and understanding. May you walk worthily of God and please Him in all things, bearing fruit in every good work and growing in the knowledge of God. May you be completely strengthened through His glorious power unto perfect patience and long-suffering; joyfully rendering thanks to God the Father, Who has made us worthy to share the lot of the saints in light. He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of His beloved Son, in Whom we have our redemption, through His Blood, the remission of our sins.

**Gradual: Ps. 43, 8-9.** You saved us, O Lord, from our foes, and those who hated us You put to shame. *V.* In God we gloried day by day; Your name we praised always. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* **Ps. 129, 1.2.** Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord; Lord, hear my prayer! Alleluia.

**Gospel: Matt. 24, 15-35.** At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "When you see the abomination of desolation, which was spoken of by Daniel the prophet, standing in the holy place—let him who reads understand—then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains; and let him who is on the housetop not go down to take anything from his house; and let him who is in the field not turn back to take his cloak. But woe to those who are with child, or have infants at the breast in those days! But pray that your flight may not be in the winter, or on the Sabbath. For then there will be great tribulation, such as has not been from the beginning of the world until now, nor will be. And unless those days had been shortened, no living creature would be saved. But for the sake of the elect those days will be shortened. Then if anyone say to you, 'Behold, here is the Christ,' or, 'There He is,' do not believe it. For false christs and false prophets will arise, and will show great signs and wonders, so as to lead astray, if possible, even the elect. Behold, I have told it to you beforehand. If therefore they say to you, 'Behold, He is in the desert,' do not go forth; 'Behold, He is in the inner chambers,' do not believe it. For as the lightning comes forth from the east and shines even to the west, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be. Wherever the body is, there will the eagles be gathered together. But immediately after the tribulation of those days, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give her light, and the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers of heaven will be shaken. And then will appear the sign of the Son of Man in heaven; and then will all tribes of the earth mourn, and they will see the Son of Man coming upon the clouds of heaven with great power and majesty. And He will send forth His angels with a trumpet and a great sound, and they will gather His elect from the four winds, from one end of the heavens to the other. Now from the fig tree learn this parable. When its branch is now tender, and the leaves break forth, you know that summer is near. Even so, when you see all these things, know that it is near, even at the door. Amen I say to you, this generation will not pass away till all these things have been accomplished. Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away."

**Offertory: Ps. 129, 1. 2.** Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord; Lord, hear my prayer! Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord.

**Secret:** Be propitious, O Lord, to our supplications, and accepting the offerings and prayers of Your people, convert the hearts of us all to Yourself, that being freed from earthly desires, we may pass on to the desires of heaven.

**Communion: Mark 11, 24.** Amen I say to you, all things whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you shall receive, and it shall be done to you.

**Postcommunion:** Grant, we beseech You, O Lord, that by this sacrament, which we have received, whatever is corrupted in our souls may be restored by the gift of its efficiency.

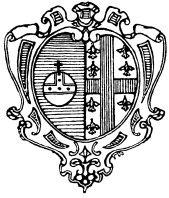

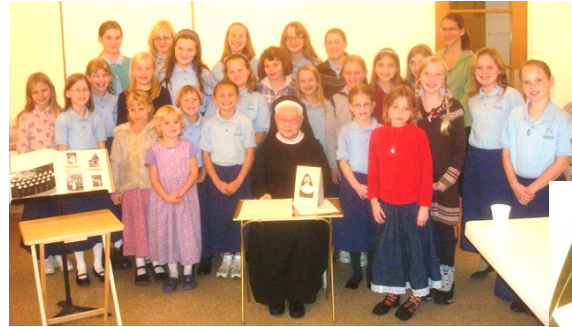
