FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Introit: Ps. 24, 1-3. To You I lift up my soul: in You, O my God, I trust; let me not be put to shame; let not my enemies exult over me. No one who waits for You shall be put to shame.

Ps. 24, 4. Your ways, O Lord, make known to me; teach me Your paths. *V.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Prayer: O Lord, we beseech You, stir up Your power, and come; that by Your protection we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins, and to be saved by Your deliverance.

Epistle: Rom. 13, 11-14. Brethren: Understand, for it is now the hour for us to rise from sleep, because now our salvation is nearer than when we came to believe. The night is far advanced; the day is at hand. Let us therefore lay aside the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light. Let us walk becomingly as in the day, not in revelry and drunkenness, not in debauchery and wantonness, not in strife and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ.

Gradual: Ps. 24, 3, 4. No one who waits for You shall be put to shame. *V.* Your ways, O Lord, make known to me; teach me Your paths.

Alleluia, alleluia. V. **Ps. 84, 8.** Show us, O Lord, Your kindness, and grant us Your salvation. *Alleluia.*

Gospel: Luke 21, 25-33. At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "There will be signs in the sun and moon and stars, and upon the earth distress of nations bewildered by the roaring of sea and waves; men fainting for fear and for expectation of the things that are coming on the world; for the powers of heaven will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming upon a cloud with great power and majesty. But when these things begin to come to pass, look up, and lift up your heads, because your redemption is at hand." And He spoke to them a parable.

"Behold the fig tree, and all the trees. When they now put forth their buds, you know that summer is near. Even so, when you see these things coming to pass, know that the kingdom of God is near. Amen I say to you, this generation will not pass away till all things have been accomplished. Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away."

Offertory: Ps. 24, 1-3. To You I lift up my soul; in You, O my God, I trust; let me not be put to shame; let not my enemies exult over me. No one who waits for You shall be put to shame.

Secret: Grant, O Lord, that these sacred mysteries may cleanse us by their powerful virtue, and bring us with more purity to Him, Who was the author of them.

Communion: Ps. 84, 13. The Lord will give His benefits: and our land shall yield its increase.

Postcommunion: May we receive Your mercy in the midst of Your temple, O Lord; that we may anticipate with due honor the coming solemnities of our renewal.

(Beginning on Monday, November 29, 2010)

O Most Holy Virgin who wast pleasing to God and didst become His Mother. Immaculate in your body, in your soul, in your faith and in your love, we beseech thee to look graciously upon the wretched who implore thy powerful protection. The wicked serpent, against whom the primal curse was hurled, continues nonetheless to wage war and to lay snares for the unhappy children of Eve. Ah, do thou, our blessed Mother, our Queen and Advocate, who from the first instant of thy conception didst crush the head of our enemy, receive the prayers that we unite single-heartedly to thine and conjure thee to offer at the throne of God, that we may never fall into the snares that are laid for us, in such wise that we may all come to the haven of salvation; and in the midst of so many dangers may holy Church and the fellowship of Christians everywhere sing once more the hymn of deliverance, victory and peace. Amen.

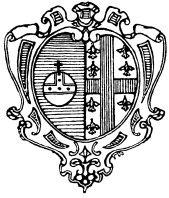

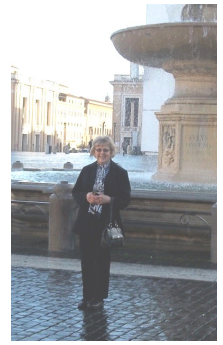
