Resumed Fifth Sunday after Epiphany

Introit: Ps. 96, 7, 8. Adore God, all you His angels: Sion hears and is glad, and the cities of Juda rejoice. **Ps. 96, 1.** The Lord is King; let the earth rejoice; let the many isles be glad.

Prayer: We beseech You, O Lord, in Your unceasing goodness, guard Your family; that we who lean only upon the hope of Your heavenly grace may always be defended by Your protection.

Epistle: Col. 3, 12-17. Brethren: Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, a heart of mercy, kindness, humility, meekness, patience. Bear with one another and forgive one another, if anyone has a grievance against any other; even as the Lord has forgiven you, so also do you forgive. But above all these things have charity, which is the bond of perfection. And may the peace of Christ reign in your hearts; unto that peace, indeed, you were called in one body. Show yourselves thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you abundantly: in all wisdom teach and admonish one another by psalms, hymns and spiritual songs, singing in your hearts to God by His grace. Whatever you do in word or in work, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, giving thanks to God the Father through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Gradual: Ps. 101, 16-17. The nations shall revere Your name, O Lord, and all the kings of the earth Your glory. *V.* For the Lord has rebuilt Sion, and He shall appear in His glory.
Alleluia, alleluia, *V.* **Ps. 96, 1.** The Lord is King; let the earth rejoice; let the many isles be glad. Alleluia.

Gospel: Matt. 13, 24-30. At that time, Jesus spoke this parable to the crowds: "The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field; but while men were asleep, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and went away. And when the blade sprang up and brought forth fruit, then the weeds appeared as well. And the servants of the householder came and said to him, 'Sir, did you not sow good seed in your field? How then does it have weeds?' He said to them, 'An enemy has done this.' And the servants said to him, 'Will you have us go and gather them up?' 'No,' he said, 'lest in gathering the weeds you root up the wheat along with them. Let both grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will say to the reapers: Gather up the weeds first, and bind them in bundles to burn; but gather the wheat into my barn.' "

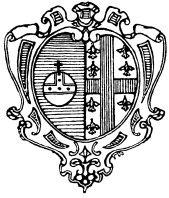

INSTRUCTIONS

2. Father will cut off the top portion of the form (with the family's name) and keep it to provide confidentiality.
3. Father will give the numbered bottom portion of the form (with gift request) to the *Giving Tree Committee* (Carole Fink, Mary Kunz or Marilyn Heidvogel.)
4. The *Giving Tree Committee* will have the number of each family/individual and will then assign a gift tag number to each family member.
5. A number gift tag will be put on the *Giving Tree* (with each gift request) on Saturday, November 27, 2010.
6. The kind giver will pick a gift tag from the *Giving Tree*, purchase the requested item, gift wrap it, place the numbered tag back on the gift and return the gift to the box under the *Giving Tree* by December 12, 2010
7. When all gifts are returned to the *Giving Tree*, Father will call the families and make arrangements for them to pick up the gifts.
