## SOVEREIGN PRIEST

### EXTERNAL SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI

**Introit: Ps. 80, 17.** He fed them with the best of wheat, alleluia; and filled them with honey from the rock, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. **Ps. 80, 2.** Sing joyfully to God our strength; acclaim the God of Jacob.

**Prayer:** O God, under a marvelous sacrament You have left us the memorial of Your Passion; grant us, we beseech You, so to venerate the sacred mysteries of Your Body and Blood, that we may ever perceive within us the fruit of Your Redemption.

**Epistle: 1 Cor. 11, 23-29.** Brethren: I myself have received from the Lord (what I also delivered to you), that the Lord Jesus, on the night in which He was betrayed, took bread, and giving thanks broke, and said, "Take and eat. This is My Body which shall be given up for you; do this in remembrance of Me." In like manner also the cup, after He had supped, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My Blood; do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me. For as often as you shall eat this Bread, and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord, until He comes." Therefore whoever eats this Bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily, will be guilty of the Body and the Blood of the Lord. But let a man prove himself, and so let him eat of that Bread, and drink of the cup; for he who eats and drinks unworthily, without distinguishing the Body, eats and drinks judgment to himself.

**Gradual: Ps. 144, 15, 16.** The eyes of all look hopefully to You, O Lord; and You give them their food in due season. *V.* You open Your hand; and satisfy the desire of every living thing. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* **John 6, 56, 57.** My Flesh is food indeed, and My Blood is drink indeed. He who eats My Flesh, and drinks My Blood, abides in Me and I in him.

**Gospel: John 6, 56-59.** At that time, Jesus said to the crowds of the Jews: "My Flesh is food indeed, and My Blood is drink indeed. He who eats My Flesh, and drinks My Blood, abides in Me and I in him. As the living Father has sent Me, and as I live because of the Father, so he who eats Me, he also shall live because of Me. This is the Bread that has come down from heaven; not as your fathers ate the manna, and died. He who eats this Bread shall live forever."

**Offertory: Lev. 21, 6.** The priests of the Lord offer incense and loaves to God, and therefore they shall be sacred to their God and shall not profane His name. Alleluia.

**Secret:** We beseech You, O Lord, graciously grant to Your Church the gifts of unity and peace, which, in the gifts offered, are mystically signified.

**Communion: 1 Cor. 11, 26, 27.** As often as you shall eat this Bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord, until He comes. Therefore whoever eats this Bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily, will be guilty of the Body and Blood of the Lord, alleluia.

**Postcommunion:** Grant us, we beseech You, O Lord, to be filled with the eternal enjoyment of Your Divinity, which is prefigured by the reception of Your precious Body and Blood in this life.
