FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Introit: Ps. 24, 1-3. To Thee, O Lord have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust; let me not be ashamed. Neither let my enemies laugh at me; for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. **Ps. 24, 4.** Show, O Lord, Thy ways to me, and teach me Thy paths. *V.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. To Thee, O Lord, etc.

Collect: Stir up, O Lord, Thy might, we pray Thee, and come; That, defended by Thee, we may deserve rescue from approaching dangers brought on by our sins, and being set free by Thee, obtain our salvation. Who livest.

For the Pope: O God, the Shepherd and Ruler of all the faithful, look down favorably upon Thy servant Benedict, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church; grant, we beseech Thee, that he may benefit both by word and example those over whom he is set, and thus attain unto life eternal, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

Epistle: Rom. 13, 11-14. Brethren, knowing the time, that it is now the hour for us to rise from sleep; for now our salvation is nearer than when we believed. The night is past, and the day is at hand; let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light. Let us walk honestly as in the day; not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and impurities, not in contention and envy; but put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ.

Gradual: Ps. 24, 3, 4. None of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. *V.* Show, O Lord, Thy ways to me, and teach me Thy paths. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* **Ps. 84, 8.** Show us, O Lord, Thy mercy: and grant us Thy salvation. Alleluia.

Gospel: Luke 21, 25-33. At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: There shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars: and upon the earth distress of nations, by reason of the confusion of the roaring of the sea and of the waves, men withering away for fear and expectation of what shall come upon the whole world. For the powers of heaven shall be moved; and then they shall see the Son of man coming in a cloud with great power and majesty. But when these things begin to come to pass, look up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is at hand. And He spoke to them a similitude: See the fig-tree, and all the trees: when they now shoot forth their fruit, you know that summer is nigh; so you also, when you shall see these things come to pass, know that the kingdom of God is at hand. Amen I say to you, this generation shall not pass away, till all things be fulfilled. Heaven and earth shall pass away, but My words shall not pass away.

Offertory: Ps. 24, 1-3. To Thee have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust; let me not be ashamed: neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded.

Secret: Cleansing us by their mighty power, may these Holy Mysteries, O Lord, make us come more pure before Thee who art their author. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: We beseech Thee, O Lord, that Thou mayest be appeased by the gifts we offer, and govern by Thy continual protection Thy servant Benedict, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church. Through our Lord.

Communion: Ps. 84, 13. The Lord will give goodness: and our earth shall yield her fruit.

Postcommunion: May we receive Thy mercy, O Lord, in the midst of Thy temple, that with due reverence we may prepare for the coming festival of our redemption. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: May the reception of this Divine Sacrament protect us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and ever save and defend Thy servant Benedict, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

The Christmas Wafer Tradition

On Christmas Eve, families in Poland, Lithuania, the Czech and Slav Republics have practiced the breaking and sharing of the Oplatek (Christmas Wafer) for centuries.

On the Holy Night, a feast is prepared for family & friends who have gathered, with an extra place set for a beggar (Our Lord) who may come to the door, or a poor family (the Holy Family) looking for a place to stay. The host or hostess leads the group in special prayer and hands the oplatek out to each participant. The participants break off a piece of the oplatek and exchange it with others offering good wishes & blessings to everyone else.

Traditionally at midnight, the head of the household takes the pink colored oplatek and shares it with the animals on his or her farm or in their home. This ritual commemorates the Holy Night when even animals were able to speak, reminding us that we are all God's creatures.
