SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Introit: Is. 30, 30. People of Sion, behold the Lord shall come to save the nations; and the Lord shall make the glory of His voice to be heard in the joy of your heart. **Ps. 79, 2.** Give ear, O Thou that rulest Israel: Thou that leadest Joseph like a sheep. *V.* Glory.

Collect: Stir up our hearts, O Lord, to prepare the ways of Thine only-begotten Son, that through His coming we may be worthy to serve Thee with purified minds.

For the Pope: O God, the Shepherd and Ruler of all the faithful, look down favorably upon Thy servant Benedict, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church; grant, we beseech Thee, that he may benefit both by word and example those over whom he is set, and thus attain unto life eternal, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

Epistle: Rom. 15, 4-13. Brethren, what things so-ever were written, were written for our learning; that through patience and the comfort of the Scriptures we might have hope. Now the God of patience and of comfort grant you to be of one mind one toward another, according to Jesus Christ: that with one mind, and with one mouth, you may glorify God and the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Wherefore receive one another; as Christ also hath received you, unto the honor of God. For I say that Christ Jesus was minister of the circumcision for the truth of God, to confirm the promises made unto the fathers. But that the Gentiles are to glorify God for His mercy, as it is written: Therefore will I confess to Thee, O Lord, among the Gentiles, and will sing to Thy name. And again He saith: Rejoice, ye Gentiles, with His people. And again: Praise the Lord, all ye Gentiles; and magnify Him, all ye people. And again, Isaias saith: There shall be a root of Jesse; and He that shall rise up to rule the Gentiles, in Him the Gentiles shall hope. Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing; that you may abound in hope, and in the power of the Holy Ghost.

Gradual: Ps. 49, 2, 3, 5. Out of Sion the loveliness of His beauty: God shall come manifestly. *V.* Gather ye together His saints to Him; who have set His covenant before sacrifices. Alleluia, alleluia, *V.* **Ps. 121, 1.** I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: we shall go into the house of the Lord. Alleluia.

Gospel: Matt. 11, 2-10. At that time when John had heard in prison the works of Christ: sending two of his disciples, he said to Him: Art Thou He that art to come, or look we for another? And Jesus making answer, said to them, Go and relate to John what you have heard and seen. The blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead rise again, the poor have the gospel preached to them; and blessed is he that shall not be scandalized in Me. And when they went their way, Jesus began to say to the multitudes concerning John, What went you out into the desert to see? a reed shaken with the wind? But what went you out to see? a man clothed in soft garments? Behold they that are clothed in soft garments are in the houses of kings. But what went you out to see? a prophet? yea, I tell you, and more than a prophet. For this is He of Whom it is written, Behold I send My angel before Thy face, who shall prepare Thy way before Thee.

Offertory: Ps. 84, 7, 8. O God, turning, Thou wilt bring us life; and Thy people shall rejoice in Thee: show us, O Lord, Thy mercy, and grant us Thy salvation.

Secret: Be appeased, we beseech Thee, O Lord, by the prayers and offerings of our lowliness, and where no support of merits is at hand, do Thou hasten to us with Thine aid. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: We beseech Thee, O Lord, that Thou mayest be appeased by the gifts we offer, and govern by Thy continual protection Thy servant Benedict, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church. Through our Lord.

Communion: Bar. 5, 5; 4, 36. Arise, O Jerusalem, and stand on high: and behold the joy that cometh to thee from thy God.

Postcommunion: Filled with the food of spiritual nourishing, we humbly beseech Thee, O Lord, that by our partaking of this mystery Thou wouldst teach us to condemn earthly and love heavenly things. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: May the reception of this Divine Sacrament protect us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and ever save and defend Thy servant Benedict, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

The Christmas Wafer Tradition

On Christmas Eve, families in Poland, Lithuania, the Czech and Slav Republics have practiced the breaking and sharing of the Oplatek (Christmas Wafer) for centuries.

On the Holy Night, a feast is prepared for family & friends who have gathered, with an extra place set for a beggar (Our Lord) who may come to the door, or a poor family (the Holy Family) looking for a place to stay. The host or hostess leads the group in special prayer and hands the oplatek out to each participant. The participants break off a piece of the oplatek and exchange it with others offering good wishes & blessings to everyone else.

Traditionally at midnight, the head of the household takes the pink colored oplatek and shares it with the animals on his or her farm or in their home. This ritual commemorates the Holy Night when even animals were able to speak, reminding us that we are all God's creatures.
