## SOVEREIGN PRIEST

### TENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**Introit:** *Psalm 54: 17, 18, 20, 23.* When I cried to the Lord He heard my voice, from them that draw near to me; and He humbled them, Who is before all ages, and remains for ever: cast thy care upon the Lord, and He shall sustain thee. *Ps. 54: 2.* Hear, O God, my prayer, and despise not my supplication; be attentive to me and hear me. Glory be. When I cried to the Lord.

**Collect:** O God, Who dost chiefly manifest Thy power in forbearance and mercy, multiply upon us Thy pity, that, hastening on to Thy promises, we may be made partakers of the blessings of heaven. Through our Lord.

**For the Pope:** O God, the Shepherd and Ruler of all the faithful, look down favorably upon Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church; grant, we beseech Thee, that he may benefit both by word and example those over whom he is set, and thus attain unto life eternal, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

**Epistle:** *I Corinthians 12: 2-11.* Brethren, you know that when you were heathens, you went to dumb idols, according as you were led. Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man speaking by the Spirit of God, saith Anathema to Jesus; and no man can say, The Lord Jesus, but by the Holy Ghost. Now there are diversities of graces, but the same Spirit; and there are diversities of ministries, but the same Lord; and there are diversities of operations, but the same God, Who worketh all in all. And the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man unto profit. To one indeed, by the Spirit, is given the word of wisdom; and to another, the word of knowledge, according to the same Spirit; to another, the grace of healing in one Spirit; to another, the working of miracles; to another, prophecy; to another the discerning of spirits; to another, divers kinds of tongues; to another, interpretation of speeches. But all these things one and the same Spirit worketh, dividing to every one according as He will.

**Gradual:** *Psalm 16: 8, 2.* Keep me, O Lord, as the apple of Thy eye: protect me under the shadow of Thy wings. Let my judgment come forth from Thy countenance: let Thy eyes behold the things that are equitable. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 64: 2.* A hymn, O God, becometh Thee in Sion: and a vow shall be paid to Thee in Jerusalem. Alleluia.

**Gospel:** *St. Luke 18: 9-14.* At that time, Jesus spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves as just, and despised others: Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one was a pharisee, and the other a publican. The pharisee standing, prayed thus with himself: O God, I give Thee thanks that I am not as the rest of men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers; as also is this publican. I fast twice in the week; I give tithes of all that I possess. And the publican standing afar off, would not so much as lift up his eyes towards heaven, but struck his breast, saying, O God, be merciful to me a sinner. I say to you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: because every one that exalteth himself shall be humbled, and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

**Offertory:** *Psalm 24: 1, 3.* To Thee, O Lord, have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust, let me not be ashamed: neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded.

**Secret:** Let the sacrifices dedicated to Thee, O Lord, be rendered back, since Thou hast given them to be presented for the honor of Thy name, so that in them Thou mightest afford us a remedy for all our ills. Through our Lord.

**For the Pope:** We beseech Thee, O Lord, that Thou mayest be appeased by the gifts we offer, and govern by Thy continual protection Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church. Through our Lord.

**Communion:** *Psalm 50: 21.* Thou wilt accept the sacrifice of justice, oblations, and holocausts, upon Thy altar, O Lord.

**Postcommunion:** O Lord, our God, we pray that in Thy loving-kindness Thou wilt not deprive of Thine assistance those whom Thou ceasest not to restore with divine sacraments. Through our Lord.

**For the Pope:** May the reception of this Divine Sacrament protect us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and ever save and defend Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

Grant that men, cattle, flocks, and beasts of burden find in them a remedy against sickness, pestilence, sores, injuries, spells, against the fangs of serpents or poisonous creatures. May these blessed objects be a protection against diabolical mockery, cunning, and deception wherever they are kept, carried, or otherwise used. Lastly, through the merits of the blessed Virgin Mary, whose Assumption we are celebrating, may we all, laden with the sheaves of good works, deserve to be taken up to heaven, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Let us pray: God, who on this day raised up to highest heaven the rod of Jesse, the Mother of thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, that by her prayers and patronage thou mightest communicate to our mortal nature the fruit of her womb, thy very Son, we humbly implore thee to help us use these fruits of the soil for our temporal and everlasting welfare, aided by the power of thy Son and the prayers of His glorious Mother, through Christ our Lord.
