FIFTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Introit: *Psalm 85: 1, 2, 3.* Bow down Thy ear, O Lord, to me, and hear me: save Thy servant, O my God, that trusteth in Thee: have mercy on me, O Lord, for I have cried to Thee all day. *Ps. 85: 4.* Give joy to the soul of Thy servant; for to Thee, O Lord, have I lifted up my soul. Glory. Bow.

Collect: Let Thy continual pity, O Lord, cleanse and fortify Thy Church; and, because without Thee it can not be safely established, let it ever be governed by Thy grace. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: O God, the Shepherd and Ruler of all the faithful, look down favorably upon Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church; grant, we beseech Thee, that he may benefit both by word and example those over whom he is set, and thus attain unto life eternal, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *Galatians 5: 25, 26; 6: 1-10.* Brethren, if we live in the spirit, let us also walk in the spirit. Let us not be made desirous of vainglory, provoking one another, envying one another. Brethren, and if a man be overtaken in any fault, you, who are spiritual, instruct such a one in the spirit of meekness, considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Bear ye one another's burdens, and so you shall fulfill the law of Christ. For if any man think himself to be something, whereas he is nothing, he deceiveth himself. But let every one prove his own work, and so he shall have glory in himself only, and not in another. For every one shall bear his own burden. And let him that is instructed in the word, communicate to him that instructeth him, in all good things. Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for what things a man shall sow, those also shall he reap. For he that soweth in his flesh, of the flesh also shall reap corruption: but he that soweth in the spirit, of the spirit shall reap life everlasting. And in doing good, let us not fail; for in due time we shall reap, not failing. Therefore, whilst we have time, let us work good to all men, but especially to those who are of the household of the Faith.

Gradual: *Psalm 91: 2, 3.* It is good to give praise to the Lord; and to sing to Thy name, O most High. To show forth Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth in the night. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 94: 3.* For the Lord is a great God, and a great king above all the earth. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. Luke 7: 11-16.* At that time, Jesus went into a city called Naim; and there went with Him His disciples, and a great multitude. And when He came nigh to the city, behold a dead man was carried out, the only son of his mother; and she was a widow, and much people of the city were with her. And when the Lord saw her, He had compassion on her, and said to her, Weep not. And He came near, and touched the bier. And they that carried it stood still. And He said, Young man, I say to thee, Arise: and he that was dead sat up, and began to speak. And He delivered him to his mother. And there came a fear on them all: and they glorified God, saying, A great prophet is risen up amongst us and God hath visited His people.

Offertory: *Psalm 39: 2, 3, 4.* With expectation I have waited for the Lord, and He had regard to me; and He heard my prayer, and He put a new canticle into my mouth, a song to our God.

Secret: May Thy sacraments, O Lord, keep us and guard us always from the assaults of the devil. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: We beseech Thee, O Lord, that Thou mayest be appeased by the gifts we offer, and govern by Thy continual protection Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church. Through our Lord.

Communion: *St. John 6: 52.* The bread that I will give is My flesh for the life of the world.

Postcommunion: Let the operation of the heavenly gift, O Lord, possess our souls and bodies, that, its holy grace, not our own impulses, may continually be our guide. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: May the reception of this Divine Sacrament protect us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and ever save and defend Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.
