### SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**Introit:** *Psalm 118: 137, 124.* Thou art just, O Lord, and Thy judgment is right; deal with Thy servant according to Thy mercy. *Ps. 118: 1.* Blessed are the undefiled in the way: who walk in the law of the Lord. Glory be. Thou art just, O Lord.

**Collect:** Grant Thy people, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to shun the defilements of the devil, and with pure hearts to follow Thee, the only God. Through our Lord.

**For the Pope:** O God, the Shepherd and Ruler of all the faithful, look down favorably upon Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church; grant, we beseech Thee, that he may benefit both by word and example those over whom he is set, and thus attain unto life eternal, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

**Epistle:** *Ephesians 4: 1-6.* Brethren, I, a prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that you walk worthy of the vocation in which you are called. With all humility and mildness, with patience, supporting one another in charity, careful to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace. One body and one spirit, as you are called in one hope of your calling. One Lord, one faith, one baptism. One God and Father of all, Who is above all, and through all, and in us all, Who is blessed for ever and ever. Amen.

**Gradual:** *Psalm 32: 12, 6.* Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord: the people whom He hath chosen for His inheritance. By the word of the Lord the heavens were established; and all the power of them by the Spirit of His mouth. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 101: 2.* O Lord, hear my prayer: and let my cry come to Thee. Alleluia.

**Gospel:** *St. Matthew 22: 35-46.* At that time, the Pharisees came to Jesus, and one of them, a doctor of the law, asked Him, tempting Him, Master, which is the great commandment of the law? Jesus said to him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul, and with thy whole mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. And the second is like to this: Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments dependeth the whole law and the prophets. And the Pharisees being gathered together, Jesus asked them, saying, What think you of Christ; Whose son is He? They say to Him, David's. He saith to them, How then doth David, in spirit, call Him Lord; saying, The Lord said to My Lord, Sit on My right hand until I make Thy enemies Thy footstool? If David then call Him Lord, how is He his son? And no man was able to answer Him a word; neither durst any man, from that day forth, ask Him any more questions.

**Offertory:** *Daniel 9: 17, 18, 19.* I, Daniel, prayed to my God, saying, Hear, O Lord, the prayers of Thy servant; show Thy face upon Thy sanctuary, and favorably look down upon this people upon whom Thy name is invoked, O God.

**Secret:** We implore Thy majesty, O Lord, that the holy mysteries which we are celebrating may free us of past and save us from future sins. Through our Lord.

**For the Pope:** We beseech Thee, O Lord, that Thou mayest be appeased by the gifts we offer, and govern by Thy continual protection Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church. Through our Lord.

**Communion:** *Psalm 75: 12, 13.* Vow ye, and pay to the Lord your God, all you that round about Him bring presents: to Him that is terrible, even to Him Who taketh away the spirit of princes; to the terrible with all the kings of the earth.

**Postcommunion:** By Thy grace, O almighty God, let our wicked propensities be cured and everlasting remedies be forthcoming. Through our Lord.

**For the Pope:** May the reception of this Divine Sacrament protect us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and ever save and defend Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

## Renovation of Thomas Hall

We kindly ask for your patience throughout this month of October as our church hall undergoes some significant alterations. **This week the hall will be inaccessible** as parts of the drywall are removed and tracking is installed for two movable partitions, which will allow the hall to be divided into three separate soundproof areas. The partitions themselves will be installed once the new floor is laid toward the end of the month. The primary reason for the attractive new flooring is practical rather than aesthetic. It will not require stripping and re-waxing and will thus significantly reduce the time and money expended to maintain the current flooring. Once these stages are completed, sound absorption panels will be installed on the ceiling to reduce the noise level and make conversation easier. This entire project has been made possible by a generous private donation, for which our community is eternally grateful.

## **THE CHURCH TEACHES ...**

### **Pope Pius XI on coeducation**

False also and harmful to Christian education is the so-called method of "coeducation." This too, by many of its supporters, is founded upon naturalism and the denial of original sin; but by all, upon a deplorable confusion of ideas that mistakes a leveling promiscuity and equality, for the legitimate association of the sexes. The Creator has ordained and disposed perfect union of the sexes only in matrimony, and, with varying degrees of contact, in the family and in society. Besides there is not in nature itself, which fashions the two quite different in organism, in temperament, in abilities, anything to suggest that there can be or ought to be promiscuity, and much less equality, in the training of the two sexes.



These, in keeping with the wonderful designs of the Creator, are destined to complement each other in the family and in society, precisely because of their differences, which therefore ought to be maintained and encouraged during their years of formation, with the necessary distinction and corresponding separation, according to age and circumstances. These principles, with due regard to time and place, must, in accordance with Christian prudence, be applied to all schools, particularly in the most delicate and decisive period of formation, that, namely, of adolescence; and in gymnastic exercises and deportment, special care must be had of Christian modesty in young women and girls, which is so gravely impaired by any kind of exhibition in public.
