TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Introit: *Ps. 129: 3, 4.* If Thou shalt observe iniquities, O Lord, Lord, who shall endure it? for with Thee is propitiation, O God of Israel. *Ps. 129: 1, 2.* From the depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my voice. *V.* Glory be . . . If Thou shalt observe . . .

Collect: O God, our refuge and our strength, the very author of piety, be present to the devout supplications of Thy Church, and grant that what we seek in faith we may effectively arrive at. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: O God, the Shepherd and Ruler of all the faithful, look down favorably upon Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church; grant, we beseech Thee, that he may benefit both by word and example those over whom he is set, and thus attain unto life eternal, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *Philippians 1: 6-11.* Brethren, we are confident in the Lord Jesus, that He Who hath begun a good work in you, will perfect it unto the day of Christ Jesus. As it is meet for me to think this for you all, for that I have you in my bands, and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel you are all partakers of my joy. For God is my witness, how I long after you all in the bowels of Jesus Christ. And this I pray, that your charity may more and more abound in knowledge and in all understanding; that you may approve the better things; that you may be sincere and without offence unto the day of Christ; filled with the fruit of justice, through Jesus Christ, unto the glory and praise of God.

Gradual: *Ps. 132: 1, 2.* Behold how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity. *V.* It is like the precious ointment on the head, that ran down upon the beard, the beard of Aaron. Alleluia, alleluia. *V. Ps. 113, 11.* They that fear the Lord, let them hope in Him: He is their helper and protector. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. Matthew 22: 15-21.* At that time, the Pharisees went and consulted among themselves, how to ensnare Jesus in His speech. And they send to Him their disciples, with the Herodians, saying, Master, we know that Thou art a true speaker, and teachest the way of God in truth, neither carest Thou for any man, for Thou dost not regard the person of men. Tell us therefore, what dost Thou think? Is it lawful to give tribute to Cæsar, or not? But Jesus knowing their wickedness, said, Why do you tempt me, ye hypocrites? Show Me the coin of the tribute. And they offered Him a penny. And Jesus saith to them, Whose image and superscription is this? They say to Him, Cæsar's. Then He saith to them, Render therefore to Cæsar, the things that are Cæsar's; and to God, the things that are God's.

Offertory: *Esther 14: 12, 13.* Remember me, O Lord, Thou Who rulest above all power; and give a well-ordered speech in my mouth, that my words may be pleasing in the sight of the prince.

Secret: Grant, O merciful God, that this saving oblation may forever rid us of our own guilt and defend us from all adversities. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: We beseech Thee, O Lord, that Thou mayest be appeased by the gifts we offer, and govern by Thy continual protection Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church. Through our Lord.

Communion: *Ps. 16: 6.* I have cried, for Thou, O God, hast heard me: O incline Thy ear unto me, and hear my words.

Postcommunion: We have taken the gifts of the sacred mystery, O Lord, humbly imploring that what Thou hast bidden us do in commemoration of Thee may avail unto the help of our infirmity. Who livest.

For the Pope: May the reception of this Divine Sacrament protect us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and ever save and defend Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.
