SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Introit: *Psalm 24: 6, 3, 22.* Remember, O Lord, Thy bowels of compassion, and Thy mercies that are from the beginning of the world, lest at any time our enemies rule over us: deliver us, O God of Israel, from all our tribulations. *Ps. 24, 1-2.* To Thee, O Lord, have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust; let me not be ashamed. Glory be. Remember, O Lord.

Collect: O God, Who seest how we are destitute of all strength, keep us inwardly and outwardly, that in body we may be defended from all adversities, and in mind cleansed of evil thoughts. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: O God, the Shepherd and Ruler of all the faithful, look down favorably upon Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church; grant, we beseech Thee, that he may benefit both by word and example those over whom he is set, and thus attain unto life eternal, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *I Thessalonians 4: 1-7.* Brethren, we pray and beseech you in the Lord Jesus, that as you have received of us, how you ought to walk, and to please God, so also you would walk, that you may abound the more. For you know what precepts I have given to you by the Lord Jesus. For this is the will of God, your sanctification; that you should abstain from fornication, that every one of you should know how to possess his vessel in sanctification and honor; not in the passion of lust, like the gentiles that know not God: and that no man overreach, nor deceive his brother in business; because the Lord is the avenger of all these things, as we have told you before, and have testified. For God hath not called us unto uncleanness, but unto sanctification; in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Gradual: *Psalm 24: 17, 18.* The troubles of my heart are multiplied; deliver me from my necessities, O Lord. *V.* See my abjection and my labor, and forgive all my sins.

Tract: *Psalm 105, 1-4.* Give glory to the Lord, for He is good: for His mercy endureth forever. *V.* Who shall declare the powers of the Lord? Who shall set forth all His praises? *V.* Blessed are they that keep judgment, and do justice at all times. *V.* Remember us, O Lord, in the favor of Thy people: visit us with Thy salvation.

Gospel: *St. Matthew 17: 1-9.* At that time, Jesus took Peter and James, and John his brother, and bringeth them up into a high mountain apart: and He was transfigured before them. And His face did shine as the sun, and His garments became white as snow. And behold there appeared to them Moses and Elias talking with Him. And Peter answering, said to Jesus, Lord, it is good for us to be here: if Thou wilt, let us make here three tabernacles, one for Thee, and one for Moses, and one for Elias. And as he was yet speaking, behold a bright cloud overshadowed them; and lo, a voice out of the cloud, saying, This is My beloved Son, in Whom I am well pleased; hear ye Him. And the disciples hearing, fell upon their face and were very much afraid. And Jesus came and touched them, and said to them, Arise and fear not. And they lifting up their eyes saw no one, but only Jesus. And as they came down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, saying, Tell the vision to no man, till the Son of man be risen from the dead.

Offertory: *Psalm 118: 47, 48.* I will meditate on Thy commandments, which I have loved exceedingly: and I will lift up my hands to Thy commandments, which I have loved.

Secret: Look graciously, we beg, O Lord, upon the sacrifices here before Thee, that they may profit both our devotion and our salvation. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: We beseech Thee, O Lord, that Thou mayest be appeased by the gifts we offer, and govern by Thy continual protection Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church. Through our Lord.

A LENT WELL SPENT

DAILY MASS AND STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Each day of Lent has a Mass proper to it. The lessons from the Old Testament are perfectly tied to the passages of the Gospel, which trace the entire public life of Our Lord Jesus Christ. There is no better way to observe the Great Fast of Lent than to attend Holy Mass as frequently as possible and to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, our true nourishment throughout this time of penance. Each day of Lent, the celebrant will offer a short sermon on the Mass of the day.

You are also warmly invited to make the **Stations of the Cross every Friday evening at 6:00 PM**, followed by veneration of the relic of the True Cross. This devotion dates from the earliest Christian times, when Christians went on pilgrimage to Jerusalem and traced the awful path of Our Savior to Calvary. You can gain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions each time you make the Stations of the Cross.
