FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

Introit: *Isaiah 48: 20.* Declare the voice of joy, and let it be heard, alleluia: declare it even unto the ends of the earth; the Lord hath delivered His people, alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 65: 1-2.* Shout with joy to God all the earth: sing ye a psalm to His name, give glory to His praise. Glory be. Declare the voice of joy.

Collect: O God, from Whom all good things come, generously grant to us who beseech Thee that we may, by Thy inspiration, think those things which are right and, that we perform them under Thy guidance. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: O God, the Shepherd and Ruler of all the faithful, look down favorably upon Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church; grant, we beseech Thee, that he may benefit both by word and example those over whom he is set, and thus attain unto life eternal, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *James 1: 22-27.* Dearly beloved, Be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves. For if a man be a hearer of the word, and not a doer, he shall be compared to a man beholding his own countenance in a glass. For he beheld himself, and went his way, and presently forgot what manner of man he was. But he that hath looked into the perfect law of liberty and hath continued therein, not becoming a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed. And if any man think himself to be religious, not bridling his tongue, but deceiving his own heart, this man's religion is vain. Religion clean and undefiled before God and the Father is this: to visit the fatherless and widows in their tribulation, and to keep one's self unspotted from this world.

Alleluia: Alleluia, alleluia. Christ is risen, and hath shone His light upon us whom He hath redeemed with His blood. Alleluia. *St. John 16: 28.* I went out from the Father and came into the world; again, I leave the world and go to the Father. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. John 16: 23-30.* At that time, Jesus saith to His disciples, Amen, amen I say to you, if you ask the Father anything in My name, He will give it you. Hitherto you have not asked anything in My name: ask and you shall receive, that your joy may be full. These things I have spoken to you in proverbs: the hour cometh when I will no more speak to you in proverbs, but will show you plainly of the Father. In that day, you shall ask in My name; and I say not to you that I will ask the Father for you, for the Father Himself loveth you, because you have loved Me, and have believed that I came out from God. I came forth from the Father, and am come into the world: again I leave the world, and go to the Father. His disciples say to Him, Behold, now Thou speakest plainly, and speakest no proverb. Now we know that Thou knowest all things, and Thou needest not that any man should ask Thee: by this we believe that Thou camest forth from God.

Offertory: *Psalms 65: 8, 9, 26.* O bless the Lord our God, ye gentiles, and make the voice of His praise to be heard: Who hath set my soul to live, and hath not suffered my feet to be moved: blessed be the Lord, Who hath not turned away my prayer, and His mercy from me, alleluia.

Secret: Receive, O Lord, the prayers of the faithful, with offerings of sacrifices, that through these offices of pious devotion we may pass to heavenly glory. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: We beseech Thee, O Lord, that Thou mayest be appeased by the gifts we offer, and govern by Thy continual protection Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church. Through our Lord.

Communion: *Psalms 95: 2.* Sing ye to the Lord, alleluia; sing ye to the Lord, and bless His name; show forth His salvation from day to day, alleluia, alleluia.

Postcommunion: Grant, O Lord, unto us, who have been regaled with the virtue of the heavenly table, both to desire what is right and to obtain what we desire. Through our Lord.

For the Pope: May the reception of this Divine Sacrament protect us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and ever save and defend Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

THE PILGRIM VIRGIN OF FATIMA STATUE

The Pilgrim Virgin of Fatima is waiting for your family to adopt her for a week or two. One of the most effective means of bringing Our Blessed Mother to the attention of luke-warm Christians is "The Pilgrim Virgin."

This practice originated at Fatima on the 30th anniversary (May 13th, 1947) of Our Lady's first Apparition there. On that date the Bishop of Leiria blessed two statues of Our Lady of Fatima and sent them on distant pilgrimages—one to the Far east, the other to the West. The statues are exact replicas of the official one, which was made according to the instructions of Sr. Lucia, and which is venerated in the Chapel of the Apparitions at Cova da Iria. There is reason to believe that Our Blessed Mother herself inspired this beneficial practice of "The Pilgrim Virgin." It has many times received the blessing and the approval of the Holy Father.

The basic idea of the Pilgrim Virgin is this: Most people are unable to make a pilgrimage to Fatima. Our Lady, with characteristic humility and love, overcomes this difficulty by reversing the process. She becomes the Pilgrim. Instead of your making a pilgrimage to her home at Fatima, she makes a pilgrimage to yours.
