### SECOND SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

**Introit:** *Psalm 65: 4.* Let all the earth adore Thee, O God, and sing to Thee: let it sing a psalm to Thy name, O Thou most high. *Ps. 65: 1, 2.* Shout with joy to God all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name, give glory to His praise. Glory be. Let all the earth.

**Collect:** Almighty, eternal God, Who dost govern all things in heaven and on earth, of Thy mercy hear the supplications of Thy people, and grant Thy peace in our times. Through our Lord.

**For the Pope:** O God, the Shepherd and Ruler of all the faithful, look down favorably upon Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church; grant, we beseech Thee, that he may benefit both by word and example those over whom he is set, and thus attain unto life eternal, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

**Epistle:** *Romans 12: 6-16.* Brethren, having different gifts, according to the grace that is given us; either prophecy, to be used according to the rule of faith; or ministry, in ministering; or he that teacheth in doctrine; he that exhorteth in exhorting; he that giveth with simplicity; he that ruleth with carefulness; he that showeth mercy with cheerfulness. Let love be without dissimulation. Hating that which is evil, cleaving to that which is good. Loving one another with the charity of brotherhood, in honor preventing one another. In carefulness, not slothful: in spirit fervent: serving the Lord: rejoicing in hope: patient in tribulation: instant in prayer: communicating to the necessities of the saints; pursuing hospitality. Bless them that persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that rejoice, weep with them that weep. Being of one mind one towards another; not minding high things, but consenting to the humble.

**Gradual:** *Psalm 106: 20, 21.* The Lord sent His word, and healed them: and delivered them out of their distresses. *V.* Let the mercies of the Lord give glory to Him; and His wonderful works to the children of men. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 148: 2.* Praise ye the Lord, all His angels: praise ye Him, all His hosts. Alleluia.

**Gospel:** *St. John 2: 1-11.* At that time, there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee: and the mother of Jesus was there. And Jesus also was invited, and His disciples, to the marriage. And the wine failing, the mother of Jesus saith to Him, They have no wine. And Jesus saith to her, Woman, what is it to Me and to thee? My hour is not yet come. His mother saith to the waiters, Whatsoever He shall say to you, do ye. Now there were set there six waterpots of stone, according to the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three measures apiece. Jesus saith to them, Fill the waterpots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. And Jesus saith to them, Draw out now, and carry to the chief steward of the feast: and they carried it. And when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not whence it was, but the waiters knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward calleth the bridegroom, and saith to him, Every man at first setteth forth good wine, and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now. This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee; and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.

**Offertory:** *Psalm 65: 1, 2, 16.* Shout with joy to God, all the earth: sing ye a psalm to His name: come and hear, and I will tell you, all ye that fear God, what great things the Lord hath done for my soul. Alleluia.

**Secret:** Sanctify, O Lord, the gifts we offer, and purify us from the stains of our sins. Through our Lord.

**For the Pope:** We beseech Thee, O Lord, that Thou mayest be appeased by the gifts we offer, and govern by Thy continual protection Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church. Through our Lord.

**Communion:** *St. John 2: 7, 8, 9, 10, 11.* The Lord saith: Fill the waterpots with water, and carry to the chief steward of the feast. When the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, he saith to the bridegroom: thou hast kept the good wine until now; this first miracle did Jesus before His disciples.

**Postcommunion:** May the working of Thy power, we beg Thee, O Lord, be increased in us, that, being nourished by divine sacraments, we may by Thy grace be prepared to obtain that which they promise. Through our Lord.

**For the Pope:** May the reception of this Divine Sacrament protect us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and ever save and defend Thy servant Francis, whom Thou hast been pleased to appoint pastor over Thy Church, together with the flock committed to his care. Through our Lord.

### **CHAIR OF UNITY OCTAVE** **January 18 - 25**

From the feast of St. Peter's Chair in Rome on January 18 to the feast of the Conversion of St. Paul on January 25, the Church observes the Chair of Unity Octave for the return of all separated Christians to the True Fold of Christ and for the conversion of all who do not yet know our Savior.

The prayers for the removal of schism are added after the prayers of the day at Mass, and each day of the octave is offered for a specific intention:

- January 18:** The union of all Christians in the one true faith and in the Church
- January 19:** The return of separated eastern Christians to communion with the Holy See
- January 20:** The reconciliation of Anglicans with the Holy See
- January 21:** The reconciliation of European Protestants with the Holy See
- January 22:** That American Christians become one in union with the Chair of Peter
- January 23:** The restoration of lapsed Catholics to the sacramental life of the Church
- January 24:** That the Jewish people come into their inheritance in Jesus Christ
- January 25:** The missionary extension of Christ's kingdom throughout the world

### **PRAYER FOR THE CHAIR OF UNITY OCTAVE** **January 18-25**

That they may all be one, as Thou, Father, in Me and I in Thee, that they also may be one in Us; that the world may believe that Thou hast sent Me.

V. I say unto thee, that thou art Peter,  
R. And upon this rock I will build My Church.

Let us pray. Lord Jesus Christ, who didst say to Thine Apostles: peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you, look not upon my sins, but upon the faith of Thy Church; and vouchsafe unto her that peace and unity which is agreeable to Thy will: who livest and reignest God forever and ever. Amen.

### **PRAYER TO OUR LADY OF THE ATONEMENT**

O Virgin Immaculate, thou who by a singular privilege of grace wast preserved from original sin, look in pity upon our separated brethren, who are nevertheless thy children, and call them back to the center of unity. Not a few of them, although separated from the Church, have kept a certain veneration for thee; and do thou, generous as thou art, reward them for it, by obtaining for them the grace of conversion. Thou wast conqueror of the infernal serpent from the first instant of thy existence; renew even now, for it is now more necessary than ever before, thine ancient triumphs; glorify thy divine Son, bring back to Him the sheep that have strayed from the one fold and place them once more under the guidance of the universal Shepherd who holds the place of thy Son on earth; let it be thy glory, O Virgin who destroyest all heresies, to restore unity and peace once more to all the Christian people.

R. That there may be fulfilled the prayer of thy divine Son: "That all may be one."
