EIGHTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Introit: *Psalm 47: 10, 11.* We have received Thy mercy, O God, in the midst of Thy temple; according to Thy name, O God, so also is Thy praise unto the ends of the earth: Thy right hand is full of justice. *Ps. 47: 2.* Great is the Lord and exceedingly to be praised, in the city of our God, in His holy mountain. Glory be. We have received Thy mercy.

Collect: Ever graciously bestow upon us in abundance, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the spirit of thinking and doing what things are right, that we, who cannot exist without Thee, may have the strength to live in conformity with Thee. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *Romans 8: 12-17.* Brethren, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh; for if you live according to the flesh, you shall die, but if by the spirit you mortify the deeds of the flesh, you shall live. For whosoever are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God. For you have not received the spirit of bondage again in fear, but you have received the spirit of adoption of sons, whereby we cry Abba (Father). For the Spirit Himself giveth testimony to our spirit, that we are the sons of God; and if sons, heirs, also; heirs indeed of God, and joint heirs with Christ.

Gradual: *Psalm 30: 3.* Be Thou unto me a God, a protector, and a place of refuge, to save me. *Ps. 70: 1.* In Thee, O God, have I hoped: O Lord, let me never be confounded. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 47: 2.* Great is the Lord, and exceedingly to be praised; in the city of our God, in His holy mountain. Alleluia.

Gospel: *St. Luke 16: 1-9.* At that time, Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: There was a certain rich man who had a steward; and the same was accused unto him that he had wasted his goods; and he called him, and said to him, How is it that I hear this of thee? give an account of thy stewardship, for now thou canst be steward no longer. And the steward said within himself, What shall I do, because my lord taketh away from me the stewardship? To dig I am not able: to beg I am ashamed. I know what I will do, that when I shall be put out of the stewardship, they may receive me into their houses. Therefore calling together every one of his lord's debtors, he said to the first, How much dost thou owe my lord? But he said, A hundred barrels of oil. And he said to him, Take thy bill, and sit down quickly and write fifty. Then he said to another, And how much dost thou owe? Who said, A hundred quarters of wheat. He said to him, Take thy bill, and write eighty. And the lord commended the unjust steward, for as much as he had done wisely; for the children of this world are wiser in their generation than the children of light. And I say to you, Make unto you friends of the mammon of iniquity, that when you shall fail, they may receive you into everlasting dwellings.

Offertory: *Ps. 17: 28, 32.* Thou wilt save the humble people, O Lord, and wilt bring down the eyes of the proud; for Who is God but Thee, O Lord?

Secret: Receive, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the gifts which out of Thine own bounty we bring to Thee, that these most holy mysteries may, by the operation of the power of Thy grace, both sanctify us in the conduct of our present lives and lead us unto everlasting joys. Through our Lord.

Communion: *Psalm 33: 9.* Taste and see that the Lord is sweet: blessed is the man that hopeth in Him.

Postcommunion: Let the heavenly mystery be to us, O Lord, the restoration of soul and body, that, as we perform its worship, we may experience its effect. Through our Lord.

What does it mean to pray for the intentions of the Holy Father?

The conditions for obtaining a plenary indulgence are Sacramental Confession within about a week's time, reception of Holy Communion, and reciting some prayers (at least one Our Father and one Hail Mary) for the intentions of the Holy Father. This is different from praying for the Holy Father himself, as we do at Mass. What, precisely, does it mean to pray for his intentions?

According to the Church's official decree on indulgences, the Pope's intention, in virtue of his office, always includes the following objects:

1. The progress of the Faith and triumph of the Church.
2. Peace and union among Christian Princes and Rulers.
3. The conversion of sinners.
4. The uprooting of heresy.

It is good for you to have these specific intentions in mind when you pray for the Holy Father's intentions. Even if you do not think of them specifically, however, your prayer is still valid, as they are included in the intention of Holy Mother Church. Of course the Pope may have other personal intentions, but it is not necessary that these form a part of your prayer.

O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls to Heaven, especially those most in need of Thy mercy.

O my Jesus, it is for love of Thee, for the conversion of poor sinners, and in reparation for the offences committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary, that I offer this sacrifice to Thee.

The Two Prayers taught by Our Lord:

Sweet Heart of Mary, be the salvation of Russia, Spain, Portugal, Europe and the whole world.

By thy pure and Immaculate Conception, O Mary, obtain for me the conversion of Russia, Spain, Portugal, Europe and the entire world.
