#### SUNDAY WITHIN THE OCTAVE OF CHRISTMAS

**Introit: Wis. 18, 14, 15.** While all things were in quiet silence, and the night was in the midst of her course, Thy almighty word, O Lord, came from heaven, from Thy royal throne. **Ps. 92, 1.** The Lord hath reigned, He is clothed with beauty: the Lord is clothed with strength, and hath girded Himself. *V.* Glory.

**Collect:** O almighty and eternal God, direct our actions in conformity with Thy good pleasure, that in the name of Thy beloved Son we may be worthy to abound in good works. Who with Thee.

**Epistle: Gal. 4, 1-7.** Brethren, as long as the heir is a child, he differeth nothing from a servant, though he be lord of all: but is under tutors and governors until the time appointed by the father: so we also, when we were children, were serving under the elements of the world. But when the fullness of the time was come, God sent His Son, made of a woman, made under the law: that He might redeem them who were under the law; that we might receive the adoption of sons. And because you are sons, God hath sent the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying: Abba, Father. Therefore now he is not a servant, but a son; and if a son, an heir also through God.

**Gradual: Ps. 44, 3, 2.** Thou art beautiful above the sons of men: grace is poured abroad in Thy lips. *V.* My heart hath uttered a good word, I speak my works to the King: my tongue is the pen of a scrivener that writeth swiftly. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* **Ps. 92, 1.** The Lord hath reigned, He is clothed with beauty: the Lord is clothed with strength, and hath girded Himself with power. Alleluia.

**Gospel: Luke 2, 33-40.** At that time, Joseph and Mary, the mother of Jesus, were wondering at these things which were spoken concerning Him. And Simeon blessed them, and said to Mary His mother: Behold this child is set for the fall, and for the resurrection of many in Israel, and for a sign which shall be contradicted: and thy own soul a sword shall pierce, that out of many hearts thoughts may be revealed. And there was one Anna, a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Aser; she was far advanced in years, and had lived with her husband seven years from her virginity. And she was a widow until fourscore and four years; who departed not from the temple, by fastings and prayers serving night and day. Now she at the same hour coming in, confessed to the Lord; and spoke of Him to all that looked for the redemption of Israel. And after they had performed all things according to the law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee, to their city Nazareth. And the child grew and waxed strong, full of wisdom, and the grace of God was in Him.

**Offertory: Ps. 92, 1, 2.** God hath established the world, which shall not be moved: Thy throne, O God, is prepared from of old; Thou art from everlasting.

**Secret:** Grant, we beseech Thee, O almighty God, that the gift present before the eyes of Thy majesty may both obtain for us the grace of godly devotion and win its effect in a blessed eternity. Through our Lord.

**Communion: Matt. 2, 20.** Take the child and His mother, and go into the land of Israel: for they are dead that sought the life of the child.

**Postcommunion:** By the operation of this mystery, O Lord, may our sins be purged, and our just desires fulfilled. Through our Lord.

(Available in Scholz Hall after January 6)

It has been a tradition in the Catholic Church to bless chalk for Epiphany, and then use the blessed chalk as part of blessing one's home in the New Year.

The home blessing can be done as follows:

Use the blessed chalk to write:

20+C+M+B+22

above the doorways: 2022 for the year; C, M, B for the 3 Magi – Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar – and for *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, Latin for

“May Christ Bless this House.”

As you are writing, you may say one of the following prayers:

*May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is Lord, forever and ever. Amen.*

*Lord our God, bless this household.*

*May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and the keeping of Thy law.*

*We give thanks to Thee, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, now and forever. Amen.*
