OPEN TO ALL

Though specifically designed for the boys and girls of our Oratories and Apostolates, the Camps are open to all, with the understanding that it is targeted towards the Catholic formation of our youth.

ORGANIZATION

The Camps are organized by the Rector of St. Mary's Oratory, Wausau, with the help of the men of the *Holy Name Society* for the Boys' Camp, and the ladies of the *Altar & Rosary Society* for the Girls'. Some of them will be at the Camps to take care of different aspects of the them and to assure safety and discipline.

AGE GROUPS

The Camps will be divided not only by teams, but within the teams by age group (two age groups), allowing activities to be more proper to one's age. They will also have activities that will be in common (both older and younger).

CHAPERONES

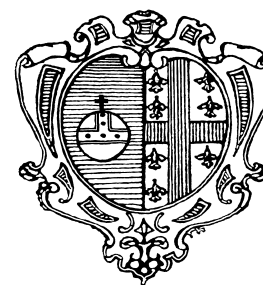
Each Camp will have a number of chaperones to assure its good and smooth development. To the Chaperones will be assigned different tasks so that everyone will be involved and no one will be idle.

- 3) List of things each participant needs to bring.

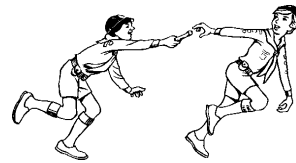
FAITH FORMATION



Though our Camps provide opportunities for lots of fun for the children, their main purpose is the Catholic formation of our boys and girls. Our intention is to cooperate with good Catholic parents in the faith-formation of our young by teaching them virtue, discipline, and above all love of God and neighbor.

COMPETING TEAMS

The Camps will be divided into 4 (four) teams that will compete and at the same time take upon themselves certain tasks and responsibilities for the Camp's organization.



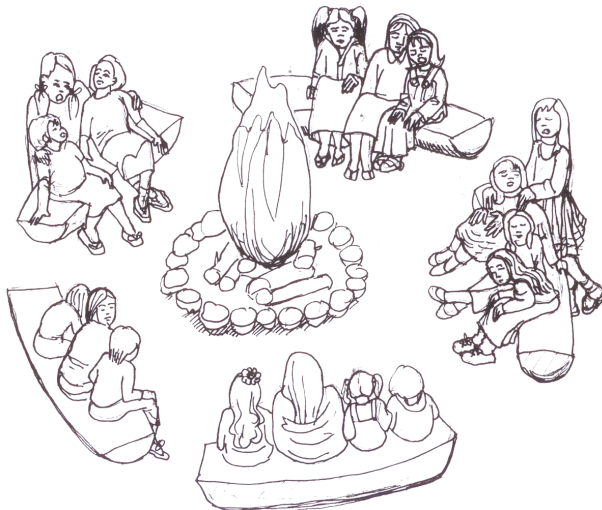
PATRON SAINT



Each TEAM will be dedicated to a Patron Saint. Each day of the Camps will be dedicated to one of those Saints. And every day one of the four Priests present at the Camps will, each one in his turn, give a talk about the life and example of a virtue of that Saint. The corresponding Team will then prepare a skit on their Patron Saint's life.



AROUND THE CAMPFIRE



Lots of the Camp activity will take place around the campfire, mainly all the meals and the evening skits, as well as musical performances. It is a moment of great entertainment but also a moment of learning discipline and good camaraderie. Each day a new team will be assigned to the meal service, while another team is assigned for the washing of the dishes and another to the making of the bonfire, etc.

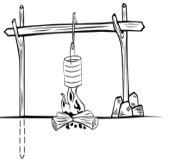


SACRAMENTS & SPIRITUALITY

Every day will begin with Holy Mass. Following the spirituality and charisma of the *Institute of Christ the King*, the Mass will be said according to the *Extraordinary Form* (in Latin.) During Holy Mass, as well as all throughout the Camps, Confession will be available. The children will be encouraged to go to Confession at least once during the Camp days.



COOKING - All meals (breakfast, lunch, dinner and an afternoon snack) will be provided by our special cooking teams from the *Altar & Rosary Society* (Girl's Camp) and the *Holy Name Society* (Boy's Camp). In the Registration Package you will find a form for you to indicate food allergies that you or your child may have.



COOKING CONTEST



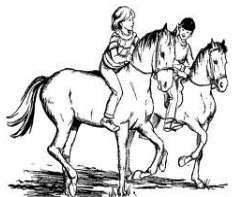
For the Girls' Camp there will be – as in the preceding years – a cooking contest. Each team will be equipped with similar cooking materials and the same ingredients to prepare a dinner. This dinner will be offered to the chaperones and to a judging team evaluating the quality of the cooking, presentation, and serving of the meal.

VARIETY OF ACTIVITIES

A variety of fun and safe youth activities will be provided for the formation and entertainment of the Camp participants. From fishing (fishing contest) to horse-back-riding, to target shooting for the boys (safe program professionally run and supervised), to lively formation meetings, to different and very amusing outdoor and indoor games. These will be dependent upon weather, of course, and other circumstances.

Safety will always be a main concern. Children who do not abide by safety instructions or disrupt the discipline or good moral atmosphere of the Camps by their poor behavior will be asked to leave. (Parents will be called and asked to come pick them up.) For the closing of the Camps, the parents' presence will be appreciated for the **closing award ceremony**.
