From the desk of the Rector

My dear faithful,

Our dear founder and Prior General, Monsignor Gilles Wach has come to visit the Institute's apostolates in the United States, as is his custom every year. We know, what a special blessing and great privilege this is and we want him to know how much his presence means to all of us priests, oblates and faithful, members of the same spiritual family.

Before coming to the United States Monsignor Wach visited the Institute apostolates in a country that is very dear, not to me alone, for having been a missionary there, but to all of the members of the Institute. Gabon, in Equatorial Africa, can be rightly called the Institute's mother country.

God has blessed us so far with three missions in Gabon, and I had the fortune to work two years in one of them, in the Mission of the Holy Ghost. This former Holy-Ghost-Father Mission is located in the south of the country, along the shores of the Atlantic Ocean.

The occasion for Monsignor's trip to Gabon was the blessing of the foundation stone of the new church we built in Libreville, the capital of Gabon. Msgr. Basile M've had graciously accepted to officiate at this literally groundbreaking ceremony, where numerous representatives of the civil authorities and many faithful were present.

Presently, Monsignor Schmitz and Father Talarico accompany our Prior General during his first visit here at St. Anthony's. There is much for him to see and especially many wonderful people and families to meet. I do not have the slightest doubt that, after what Monsignor Wach will have seen during his visit he will be looking forward to coming back, hopefully soon. He already mentioned, how impressed he is by the results of the good and hard work that has been accomplished here. When writing to you, he has already visited the chapel and the rectory. He is thankful to Fr. Talarico and Monsignor Schmitz and especially also to Fr. Wickens and all who helped making St. Anthony's into what it is today. It is so clear to him that God's Holy Providence has already accomplished many wonderful things here. Your warm and kind welcome this Sunday will, without doubt, but enhance this impression.

Finally, I would like to point out that Monsignor is not only God's instrument in founding the Institute together with Father Philippe Mora, the present rector of our seminary. He is and continues to be most importantly its spiritual father and leader.

From my own personal experience I know this: Besides the good, solid and orthodox professors and excellent priest-examples in the seminary, Monsignor's patiently Salesian teachings of an authentically Catholic love for the classical Liturgy and for Holy Mother Church are the most influential elements in our priests' formation. Monsignor labors unceasingly to allow the Institute to serve always more apostolates by spreading the Catholic culture and faith, promoting the glory of God by the celebration of the Divine Liturgy in its beauty ever ancient and ever new. He continues to guide our Institute and provides the much needed teachings for all of us priests, oblates, seminarians and sisters.
