We know so well that we are but stewards, and this life is a test. The Lord and Master of the House will return. Soon, even before the last judgment, everyone will stand before Christ. Each one will render an account of his stewardship, and an unending moment called Eternity will be the reward.

The damned, those who abused their freedom and gifts, are not only covered by the fiery darkness of the abyss, but also with oblivion. Even those who were once her children the Church forgets. The damned cannot and they would not want to be helped.

On All Saints Day we remember and ask for of all those who loved God more than themselves. They chose Life, they chose God the life of their souls.

During the rest of the month our special attention is directed to those that are rightly qualified as Poor Souls. These souls are holy because when they lost physical life their souls were filled with divine life, sanctifying grace. They are imperfect saints though. In His mercy God completes their sanctification after death and judgment in purgatory. Venial sin and the disorder caused in the temporal order and not made up for must be expiated: "There shall not enter into it [Heaven] any thing defiled" (Apoc. 21:27).

The Poor Souls suffer more intensely than anyone in this world. The predominant pain is the pain of loss: losing the face to face with God. In addition there is also a mysterious fire that purifies them. Like the fire in hell, it burns the spiritual substance of the soul. Unlike hell it ends when the soul is purged and ready to enter Heaven. Purgatory will end on (Last) Judgment Day.

For children of such a merciful Heavenly Father it is becoming to practice mercy toward these souls who suffer most. A great number of our friends and family members might be in Purgatory at this very moment. The time of merit has passed and "the night has come when no one can work." (Jn 9:4) The sufferings of the poor souls are not meritorious anymore, but ours are.

Our prayers and good works (almsgiving, fasting etc.) certainly help. The living and real Sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross, Holy Mass, is most powerful. From the wounds of Christ flows also the redeeming power of Indulgences which the Church makes available and encourages us to gain. The debt of temporal punishment is paid for by the overflowing charity, penances and merits of the Redeemer, His Blessed Mother and the martyrs and saints.

May the Lord grant the living His grace and the deceased Eternal Rest. Amen.
