### **FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING OCTOBER 25, 2009**

This Solemnity has also a very special signification to the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest; it is this title of Christ as King and Sovereign Priest which the Institute has chosen as both its name and program. **Everyone who attends Holy Mass at one of the apostolates served by the Institute of Christ the King is able to gain a plenary indulgence, under normal conditions.**

### **SPIRITUAL WISDOM OF ST JEAN VIANNEY**

Go to confession to the Blessed Virgin, or to an angel; will they absolve you? No. Will they give you the Body and Blood of Our Lord? No. The Holy Virgin cannot make her Divine Son descend into the Host. You might have two hundred angels there, but they could not absolve you. A priest, however simple he may be, can do it; he can say to you, "Go in peace; I pardon you." Oh, how great is a priest! The priest will not understand the greatness of his office till he is in Heaven. If he understood it on earth, he would die, not of fear, but of love.

# ***THE MOST HOLY ROSARY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY OUR LADY OF VICTORY, HELP OF CHRISTIANS***

On October 7, 1571, a great and glorious victory over the mighty Turkish fleet was won by Catholic naval forces from Spain, Venice, and Genoa, at Lepanto. This triumph of the Cross over the Crescent was universally attributed to the powerful intercession of the Mother of God, who Pope Pius V fervently invoked with his rosary in his hand, calling on all of Christian Europe to pray with him for victory.

The Moslem force had between 12,000 and 15,000 Christian slaves as rowers of their ships & was the most powerful naval fleet in the world. The Catholic ships, greatly outnumbered, were under the command of Don Juan of Austria, and were spiritually powered by the Holy Rosary.

At the exact hour of the victory, which prevented the Islamic invasion of Europe, the Holy Pontiff who was hundreds of miles away in Rome, is said to have gotten up from a meeting, gone over to a window, & exclaimed with a supernatural radiance, "The Christian fleet is victorious!" and shed tears of thanksgiving. Admiral Andrea Doria carried a small statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe into battle with him which is now enshrined in the Church of San Stefano in Aveto, Italy. If you look up at the ceiling of Santa Maria in Aracoeli, in Rome, the gold decorations on the ceiling to honor Our Lady are from the gold taken from the Turkish galleys.

At first a local celebration, Gregory XIII instituted an annual feast of thanksgiving on the First Sun-day of October, in 1716, Clement XI commanded it to be celebrated by the universal Church. Leo XIII raised it to the rank of a double of the second class for the entire Church for the signal & countless benefits bestowed on Christendom by the devout praying of the Rosary throughout the centuries.

***Remember: The month of October is the month of the Holy Rosary!***

You will say to Him, then, O my good Angel:

That I wish to die in the Roman Catholic Apostolic Church in which all the saints since Jesus Christ have died, and out of which there is no salvation.

That I ask the grace of sharing in the infinite merits of my Redeemer and that I desire to die in pressing to my lips to the cross that was bathed in His Blood!

That I detest my sins because they displease Him, and that I pardon through love of Him all my enemies as I wish to be pardoned.

That I die willingly because He orders it and that I throw myself with confidence into His adorable Heart awaiting all His Mercy.

That in my inexpressible desire to go to Heaven I am disposed to suffer everything in may please His sovereign Justice to inflict on me.

That I love Him before all things, above all things and for His own sake; that I wish and hope to love Him with the Elect, His Angels and the Blessed Mother during all eternity.

Do not refuse, O my Angel, to be my interpreter with God, and to protest to Him that these are my sentiments and my will. Amen.
