### MY HOLY CATHOLIC FAITH

**How can the laity help the Church in her care of souls?**

**The laity can help the Church in her care of souls by leading lives that will reflect credit on the Church, and ... especially through Catholic Action.**



Catholic Action is the active participation of the laity in the apostolate of the Church under the guidance of the hierarchy. Every Catholic is obliged to help the Church to spread. Non-Catholics are most often brought into the Church by the good example of Catholics and keep away by bad example.



In the Encyclical *Ubi Arcano Dei*, Pope Pius XI tells us that this apostolate of the laity “will bring about the re-birth of the individual, the family, society, and the whole world.” To realize that such a result is possible, we need but turn to the early history of Christianity where we find the followers of Our Lord incorporating His principles in their daily lives and putting them into practice in public life as well. That procedure is Catholic Action, a sustained effort to make Christ King.

The laity can participate actively in the apostolate of the Church when they arouse the interest of non-Catholics in the Catholic

faith; promote high standards in the press, films, radio and television; participate in the work of the Confraternity of Christian doctrine; take part in the activities of Catholic societies and organizations; represent, under proper direction, the Church's position in speaking and writing.

The right and duty to engage in individual apostolate arise directly from baptism — nobody's off the hook. Individual apostolate consists in living one's ordinary, everyday life — as a spouse, parent, worker, student, or friend in the light of one's Christian faith, while giving specific, verbal testimony to that faith when circumstances permit.

It's hardly news that some Catholics fail to do these things. The convert, author, and social critic Orestes Brownson, the most intellectually distinguished American Catholic layman of his day, wrote as follows back in 1870:

*“We shall find even Catholics who...gravely tell us that their religion has nothing to do with their politics; that is, their politics are independent of their religion; that is, again politics are independent of God, and there is no God in the political order; as if a man could be an atheist in the state, and a devout Catholic in the church.”*

## EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

September 14



The true Cross of Jesus Christ, the Holy Cross, was discovered by St. Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine. In ancient times, the feast on September 14th was 'The Exaltation,' a celebration of the finding of the true Cross—this date was retained in the Eastern Church. In the eighth century, the Western Church transferred the feast to May 3rd, now entitled the 'Finding of the Cross.' September 14th, however retained the name 'The Exaltation' but became a new feast in thanksgiving for the recovery of this inestimable relic (the true Cross) a hundred years earlier, by the Great Emperor Heraclius. Previous-

ly, the infidel Chosroes, King of Persia, had possessed the relic himself, obtained from a pillaging of the city and churches of Jerusalem.

The feast of the 'Exaltation' in the Eastern Church was celebrated with great splendor. Small slivers of the Cross were, in time, brought from Jerusalem to many other churches in the East and in the West. These churches sought to imitate the solemn ceremonies in use at the time in Jerusalem as an aid to offer due homage to the Holy Cross, the triumphant standard of our salvation.

# SEVEN SORROWS OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

SEPTEMBER 15

St. Bernard taught the Church that Our Lady always aids her children when they cry to her for help. He also taught that Jesus' passion began with His birth, and that Mary's perfect obedience to God, which started before her Son was made flesh, amounted to a passion and death of her own. Mary's obedience to God's Will was perfect. Through the dreadful passion and death of her son - and through her love for Him - she experienced a life full of sufferings; like that of a martyr.

Each September 15th, we honor Our Lady of Sorrows for all she has done for us. The Servite order was founded in 13th century Italy in solidarity with Mary's sorrows, but the feast is one of the great fruits of German Catholic spirituality. It has its origin in Cologne in 1413 as expiation for the Hussite heresy and spread first throughout northern Germany, then to Scandinavia and Scotland. Eventually it spread throughout Europe and the Roman Catholic world.

Traditionally, Mary's seven sorrows includes the prophecy of Simeon; the flight into Egypt; having lost Jesus in Jerusalem; meeting Him on his way to Calvary; standing at the foot of His Cross; His being taken from the Cross; and at

His burial. Our Lady suffered with her Son and she herself died inside when Jesus breathed forth His last. Yet she never wavered in obedience to the Father, just as her Son never wavered. How could anyone fail to honor such faithfulness to God? We would do well here to consider the words of St. Alphonsus Liguori. He wrote:

*"If we can make no other return for so much love, at least let us give a few moments this day to consider the greatness of the sufferings by which Mary became the Queen of Martyrs; for the sufferings of her great martyrdom exceeded those of all the martyrs."*

The Blessed Virgin Mary revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373) that seven graces are granted to the souls who honor her daily by saying seven Hail Mary's while meditating on her tears and dolors. These promised are:

- 1) I will grant peace to their families.
- 2) They will be enlightened about the divine mysteries.
- 3) I will console them in their pains and I will accompany them in their work.
- 4) I will give them as much as they ask for as long as it does not oppose the adorable will of my divine Son or the sanctification of their souls.
- 5) I will defend them in their spiritual battles with the infernal enemy and I will pro-

tect them at every instant of their lives.  
6) I will visibly help them at the moment of their death, they will see the face of their Mother.

7) I have obtained (this Grace) from my divine Son, that those who propagate this devotion to my tears and dolors, will be taken directly from this earthly life to eternal happiness since all their sins will be forgiven and my Son and I will be their eternal consolation and joy.

St. Alphonsus Liguori testifies to complementary revelations given by Our Lord to St. Elizabeth of Hungary (1207-1231) where Jesus promises four special graces to those dedicated to the sufferings of the co-redeeming Mother:

1. That those who before death invoke the Blessed Mother in the name of her sorrows, should obtain true repentance of all their sins.
2. That He would protect in their tribulations all who remember this devotion, and that He would protect them especially at the hour of death.
3. That He would impress upon their minds the remembrance of His Passion, and that they should have their reward for it in Heaven.
4. That He would commit such devout clients to the hands of Mary, so that she might obtain for these souls all the graces she wanted to lavish upon them.

## Consecration to Our Lady of Sorrows

Most holy Virgin and Queen of Martyrs, Mary, would that I could be in Heaven, there to contemplate the honors rendered to thee by the Most Holy Trinity and by the whole Heavenly Court! But since I am still a pilgrim in this vale of tears, receive from me, thy unworthy servant and a poor sinner, the most sincere homage and the most perfect act of vassalage a human creature can offer thee. In thy Immaculate Heart, pierced with so many swords of sorrow, I place today my poor soul forever; receive me as a partaker in thy dolors, and never suffer that I should depart from that Cross on which thy only begotten Son expired for me. With thee, O Mary, I will endure all the sufferings, contradictions, infirmities, with which it will please thy Divine Son to visit me in this life. All of them I offer to thee, in memory of the Dolors which thou didst suffer during thy life, that every thought of my mind, every beating of my heart may henceforward be an act of compassion to thy Sorrows, and of complacency for the glory thou now enjoyest in Heaven. Since then, O Dear Mother, I now compassionate thy Dolors, and rejoice in seeing thee glorified, do thou also have compassion on me, and reconcile me to thy Son Jesus, that I may become thy true and loyal son (daughter); come on my last day and assist me in my last agony, even as thou wert present at the Agony of thy Divine Son Jesus, that from this painful exile I may go to Heaven, there to be made partaker of thy glory. Amen.
