ALL SOULS INDULGENCES

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls. On all days from November 1 through November 8 inclusive, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. Partial indulgences are granted to those who recite Lauds or Vespers of the Office of the Dead, and to those who recite the prayer:

“Requiem aeternam dona eis, Domini, et lux perpetua luceat eis. Requiescant in pace.”

-Partial Indulgence when fervently recited.

(Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let the perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace.)

MY HOLY CATHOLIC FAITH

What do we mean when we say that Christ sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty?

We mean that Our Lord as God is equal to the Father, and that as man He shares above all the saints in the glory of His Father and exercises for all eternity the supreme authority of a king over all creatures.

“Christ,” a Greek word meaning “anointed,” signifies Jesus’ threefold office as King, Priest, and Prophet, because, of old, kings, priest, and prophets were anointed.

Even as man, Christ of Himself has dominion over all creation. His Kingship rests on the fact that His human nature is immediately united to the divine Person of the Son of God, and on the fact that He redeemed all men with His precious blood.

On earth Christ exercises His kingly authority in spiritual matters through His Church. His Kingship extends also over temporal and civil matters.

SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING

~OCTOBER 29, 2017

In 1925, Pope Pius XI instituted the Feast of Christ the King as a solemn affirmation of Our Lord's Kingship over every human society. This Feast is to be celebrated on the last Sunday of October. In his Encyclical Letter *Quas primas* the pope explicates that Christ is the King of Families, Peoples and Countries and even the whole universe. Our Lord, however, wishes also to be the King of our souls. This Solemnity has also a very special significance to the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest; it is this title of Christ as King and Sovereign Priest which the Institute has chosen as both its name and program.

**Consecration of the Human Race to the
SACRED HEART OF JESUS**

To Take Place Annually on the
Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King

Most sweet Jesus, Redeemer of the human race, look down upon us, humbly prostrate before Thy altar. We are Thine and Thine we wish to be; but, to be more surely united with Thee, behold each one of us freely consecrates himself to-day to Thy Most Sacred Heart.

Many indeed have never known Thee; many, too, despising Thy precepts, have rejected Thee. Have mercy on them all, most merciful Jesus, and draw them to Thy Sacred Heart. Be Thou King, O Lord, not only of the faithful who have never forsaken Thee, but also of the prodigal children who have abandoned Thee; grant that they may quickly return to their Father's house, lest they die of wretchedness and hunger.

Be Thou King of those who are deceived by erroneous opinions, or whom discord keeps aloof,

and call them back to the harbor of truth and unity of faith, so that soon there may be but one flock and one Shepherd.

Be Thou King of all those who are still involved in the darkness of idolatry or of Islamism, and refuse not to draw them all into the light and kingdom of God. Turn Thine eyes of mercy toward the children of that race once Thy chosen people. Of old they called down upon themselves the Blood of the Savior; may it now descend upon them a laver of redemption and of life.

Grant, O Lord, to Thy Church assurance of freedom and immunity from harm; give peace and order to all nations, and make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry: Praise to the Divine Heart that wrought our salvation; to it be glory and honor forever. R. Amen.

PRAYERS TO AND FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY

...The souls in Purgatory, being beloved by God and confirmed in grace, have absolutely no impediment to prevent them from praying for us. Still, the Church does not invoke them or implore their intercession, because ordinarily they have no cognizance of our prayers. But we may piously believe that God makes our prayers known to them; and then they, full of charity as they are, most assuredly do not omit to pray for us. St. Catherine of Bologna, whenever she desired a favor, had recourse to the souls in Purgatory, and was immediately heard. She even testified that by the intercession of the souls in Purgatory, she obtained many graces which she had been unable to obtain by the intercession of the Saints...

If we desire the aid of their prayers, it is but fair that we should mind to aid them with our prayers and good works. I said it is fair, but I should have said it is our Christian duty; for charity obliges us to succor our neighbor when he requires aid and we can help him without grievous inconvenience.

If a sense of duty will not persuade us to succor them, let us think of the pleasure it will give Jesus Christ to see us endeavouring to deliver His beloved spouses from prison in order that He may have them with Him in paradise.

...St. Augustine says that God will cause those who in this life have most succored those holy souls, when they come to Purgatory themselves, to be most succored by others.
