## PRAYERS & INSTRUCTION

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SACRED TRIDUUM

**CONFESSION:** This is the sacrament of Divine mercy and healing! Through His redemptive sufferings on the Cross, our Blessed Lord and Savior Jesus Christ showed His great Mercy to the world. Jesus did not come for the just, but for sinners; to save those souls who are lost, to heal those who are sick and dead through sin. It is in this great Sacrament of Confession that the Redeemer pours forth into our souls the abundance of His Mercy, Grace, and Divine Life.

Our Mother the Church commands that we receive Jesus in Holy Communion at least once during Easter Season (in the U.S.A.—from the first Sunday of Lent through Trinity Sunday).

This is by no means enough, but to do this worthily we must be in the state of grace. To communicate with spiritual profit our dispositions of heart should be optimal. Let us use one of the many opportunities we have to receive the great Sacrament of Penance so that our Eucharistic Lord may find a worthy dwelling place in our hearts.

**HOLY THURSDAY LITURGICAL NOTE:** The adoration before the altar of repose is made in order to console Our Lord for the outrages He suffered. **ONE MAKES A DOUBLE GENUFLECTION BEFORE THE ALTAR OF REPOSE.** The Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle of repose is considered EXPOSED. He asked His Apostles "Can you not watch one hour with Me?" He asks us alike. What is an hour before the

Blessed Sacrament compared to a whole night of imprisonment and the three hours agony our Blessed Lord suffered when He hung on the Cross? Let us watch at least one hour with Our Divine Redeemer!

#### **GOOD FRIDAY- FAST & ABSTINENCE**

Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Good Friday. On this day of complete abstinence, meat, soup, or gravy made from meat are not to be eaten. Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, in addition to abstaining from meat, are bound to fast on Good Friday. Fasting means eating only one full meal per day. However two smaller meals may be take if needed, which if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity. No food is to be eaten between meals. The obligation to fast ends on one's 59th birthday.

**NOVENA OF DIVINE MERCY** The Novena of Divine Mercy begins on Good Friday. Jesus asked that the Feast of Divine Mercy (Sunday after Easter) be preceded by a Novena beginning on Good Friday. "*I desire, Jesus told Saint Faustina, "that during these nine days you bring souls to the fount of My Mercy, that they may draw therefrom strength and refreshment and whatever graces they need in the hardships of life, and, especially, at the hour of death. On each day you will bring to My Heart a different group of souls, and you will immerse them in this ocean of My Mercy, and I will bring all these souls into the house of My Father...On each*

*day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My bitter Passion, for graces for these souls."*

**HOLY SATURDAY-** If weather permits, the faithful gather before the chapel's main doors for the blessing of the Easter Fire. Please leave the area in front of the fireplace and before the doors, OPEN for the priest and the Mass Servers. Persons who prefer to stay inside may do so. **\*\*PLEASE DO NOT USE any FLASH when taking pictures, before the lights are switched on.\*\*** Reading of the Prophecies: If you use a more ancient hand missal please note that only four of the twelve prophecies marked in your missal are sung: The 1st Prophecy sung is number 1 one in your missal: (Gen. 1, 1-31 et 2, 1-2) The 2nd Prophecy is number 4:(Exod. 14, 24 -31, et 15,1) The 3rd Prophecy is number 8: (Is. 4, 1-6) The 4th Prophecy is number 11: (Deut. 31, 22-30) The faithful receiving Holy Communion during the Vigil Mass may receive again at one of the morning Masses. While the Easter Vigil does fulfil ones Sunday obligation, the Church encourages her children however to attend the Sunday morning Mass also, if possible.

MASS SERVERS participating in the PROCESSION FOR EASTER VIGIL MASS must be in cassock no later than 7:00 p.m. sharp, for a full rehearsal of the sacred ceremonies.

# PALM SUNDAY— [FOR LOW MASS ONLY]



**ANTHOIT.** *Ps. 21, 20, 22.* O Lord, remove not Thy help afar from me; look to my defense: deliver me from the lion's mouth, and my lowness from the horns of the unicorns. *Ps. 21, 2.* O God, my God, look upon me; why hast Thou forsaken me? Far from my salvation, are the words of my sins. O Lord.

**PRAYER.** Almighty and everlasting God, Who didst will that our Savior should take upon Himself our flesh, and suffer on the Cross, that all mankind might have His example of humility for their imitation: grant that we may merit both to keep in mind the lesson of His patience, and to be made partakers of His Resurrection. Through the same.

**PISTLE.** *Phil. 2,5-11.* Brethren, have this mind in you which was also in Christ Jesus, Who though He was by nature God, did not consider being equal to God a thing to be clung to, but emptied Himself, taking the nature of a slave and being made like unto men. And appearing in the form of man, He humbled Himself, becoming obedient to death, even to death on a cross. Therefore God has exalted Him and has bestowed upon Him the Name that is above every name, so that at the Name of Jesus every knee should bend of those in heaven, on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God the Father.

**RADUAL.** *Ps. 72, 24, 1, 3.* Thou hast held me by my right hand; and by Thy will Thou hast conducted me; and with glory Thou hast received me. *V.* How good is God to Israel, to those who are of a right heart! But my feet were almost moved, my steps had well-nigh slipped; because I had a zeal on occasion of sinners, seeing the peace of sinners.

**RAC.** *Ps. 21, 2-9; 18,19,22;24,32.* O God, my God, look upon me: why hast Thou forsaken me? *V.* Far from my salvation, are the words of my sins. *V.* O my God, by day shall I cry, and Thou wilt not hear; and by night, and it shall not be reputed as folly in me. *V.* But Thou dwellest in the holy place, the praise of Israel. *V.* In Thee have our fathers hoped: they have hoped, and Thou hast delivered them. *V.* They cried to Thee and they were saved: they trusted in Thee, and were not confounded. *V.* But I am a worm, and no man: the reproach of men, and the outcast of the people. *V.* All they who saw me, laughed me to scorn; they spoke with their lips, and wagged their heads. *V.* He hoped in the Lord, let Him deliver him: let Him save him, seeing he delights in Him. *V.* But they looked and stared upon me: they parted my garments amongst them, and upon my vesture they cast lots. *V.* Deliver me from the lion's mouth: and my lowness from the horns of the unicorns. *V.* You who fear the Lord, praise Him: all you the seed of Jacob, glorify Him. *V.* There shall be declared to the Lord a generation to come: and the heavens shall show forth His justice. *V.* To a people that shall be born, which the Lord has made.

**OSPEL (Low Mass Only):** After they had crucified Jesus, from the sixth hour there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. But about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Eli, Eli, lema sabathani," that is "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?" And some of the bystanders on hearing this said, "This (continued) man is calling Elias." And immediately one of them ran

and, taking a sponge, soaked it in a common wine, put it on a reed and offered it to him to drink. But the rest said, "Wait, let us see whether Elias is coming to save him." But Jesus again cried out with a loud voice, and gave up his spirit. (*Here all kneel and pause a little while in silent prayer.*) And behold, the curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom; and the earth quaked, and the rocks were rent, and the tombs were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep arose

**FFERTORY.** *Ps. 68, 21-22.* My heart has expected reproach and misery; and I looked for one who would grieve together with Me, and there was none; I sought one who would comfort Me, and found none; and they gave Me gall for My food, and in My thirst, they gave Me vinegar to drink.

**ECRET.** Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that the gift now offered in the sight of Thy Majesty, may obtain for us both the grace of devotion, and that everlasting happiness which is our aim. Through our Lord.

**COMMUNION.** *Matt. 26, 42.* Father, if this cup cannot pass away, unless I drink it, Thy will be done.

**OSTCOMMUNION.** By the working of this mystery, O Lord, may our vices be cleansed and our just desires be fulfilled.

**AST GOSPEL.** *Matt. 21, 1-9.* At that time, when Jesus was near Jerusalem, and had reached Bethphage, which is close to Mount Olivet, He sent two of His disciples on an errand; Go into the village that faces you, He told them, and the first thing you will find there will be a she-ass, tethered, and a foal at her side; untie them and bring them to Me. And if anyone speaks to you about it, tell him, The Lord has need of them, and he will let you have them without more ado. All this was so ordained, to fulfill the word spoken by the prophet: Tell the daughter of Sion, behold, thy king is coming to thee, humbly, riding on an ass, on a colt whose mother has borne the yoke. The disciples went and did as Jesus told them; they brought the she-ass and its colt, and saddled them with their garments, and bade Jesus mount. Most of the multitude spread their garments along the way, while others strewed the way with branches cut down from the trees. And the multitudes that went before Him and that followed after Him cried aloud, Hosanna for the son of David, blessed is He Who comes in the name of the Lord.
