## PRAYERS & INSTRUCTION

### LOW SUNDAY

This Sunday is called *Quasimodo*, from the first words of the Introit, or *Dominica in Albis depositis*, or *post albas depositas*, from the fact that on this day the newly baptized did no longer wear their white vestments; or *Pascha Clausum* because it was (and is still, dispensations excepted), the last day for fulfilling the Easter duty; or again, Low Sunday, perhaps in contrast to the great feast of the week before.

To teach those who, in baptism, have just been born to the life of God (*Introit*) the generosity with which they ought to bear testimony to Christ, the Church leads them to the basilica of the martyr St. Pancras, who when only twelve years old offered to Christ the testimony of his blood. Christians must stand firm, resting on their faith in Christ, the risen Son of God. St. John

tells us that this is the faith that overcomes the world, for it enables us to resist all efforts to make us fall (*Epistle*). Thus it is important that it should have a firm foundation, which the Church gives us in today's Mass.

This faith, says St. John in the Epistle, is founded on the witness of the three divine Persons and on that of water, blood and the Spirit which at baptism, on Calvary and in the life of the Church and of Christians bear testimony to the divinity of the risen Christ. His twofold appearance to the Apostles, related in the Gospel and the attitude of Thomas, yielding in the face of the evidence after showing himself unbelieving, further confirms us in our faith.

By our unshakeable faith and our blameless conduct we should bear witness

to the resurrection and divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ before the unbelieving and wicked world.

## Love is Compliant with God's Inspirations

The sun's rays give both light and warmth together. Inspirations is a ray of grace bringing light and warmth to our hearts; light to show us what is good; warmth to give us energy to go after it. All living things in this world are numbed by winter's cold; with the return of spring's warmth they come to live again - animals move more swiftly, birds fly higher with livelier song, plants gaily bud and blossom. Without inspiration, the life of the soul is sluggish, impotent, useless. Once the rays of God's inspiration strike it, however, we are aware of light and life...our minds are enlightened, our wills inflamed and quickened with strength to intend and fulfill whatever may lead to our salvation ....

The ways God has of inspiring us are past all counting... St. Mary of Egypt was inspired by seeing a picture of Our Lady; St. Anthony by hearing the Gospel read at Mass; St. Augustine by listening to the life of St. Anthony; the Duke of Gandia (St. Francis Borgia) by the sight of the empress's corpse; St. Pachomius by noticing an act of charity; the saintly Ignatius of Loyola by reading the lives of the saints.

Blessed are those whose hearts are ever open to God's inspiration; they will never lack what they need to live good, holy lives, or to perform properly the duties of their state.

The first inspiration God ever sends to a man is that of obedience. Was there ever a finer, more unmistakable inspiration than St. Paul's: 'Rise up, and go into the city; there thou shalt be told what thy work is'. He was to obey Ananias, the well-known bishop of Damascus (according to St. Dorotheus). A man who claims to be inspired, but refuses to obey his superiors or to follow their advice is an impostor.

...The three finest, surest proofs of the genuine character of inspirations are: perseverance in contrast to fickleness, peace of soul in contrast to impulsive anxiety; humble obedience in contrast to stubborn willfulness.

### DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY - PLENARY INDULGENCE

A plenary indulgence had been granted by Pope John Paul II for the devout observance on Low Sunday (Divine Mercy Sunday).

The Decree of the Holy See offers "*a plenary indulgence, granted under the usual conditions* (Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion and prayer for the intentions of Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on the First Sunday after Easter (Low Sunday) or Divine Mercy Sunday, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in thee!)..."
