



INGRUMENTIUM MALORUM

ENCYCLICAL OF POPE PIUS XII ON RECITING THE ROSARY

... Nor can We pass over in silence a new crime to which, with utmost sorrow, We want earnestly to draw not only your attention, but the attention of the clergy, of parents, and even of public authorities.

We refer to the iniquitous campaign that the impious lead everywhere to harm the shining souls of the children.

Not even the innocent age has been spared. On the contrary, audacious efforts are unfortunately made to snatch, with a gesture, from the mystical garden of the Church even the most beautiful flowers, which constitute the hope of religion and society. Considering this, one cannot be surprised if peoples groan under the weight of the Divine punishment and live under the nightmare of even greater calamities.

However, consideration of a situation so pregnant with dangers must not depress your souls, O Venerable Brethren. Instead, that Divine teaching: *"Ask and it shall be given to you; seek, and you shall find; knock, and it shall be opened to*

you" (Luke II:9) spontaneously raises your hearts with greater hope towards the Mother of God. There, the Christian people have always sought refuge in the hour of danger, because *"she has been constituted the cause of salvation for the whole human race" (St. Irenaeus).*

Venerable Brethren, ***We desire that this prayer should be offered with such greater fervor of heart as is demanded by the increased urgency of the need.*** We well know the Rosary's powerful efficacy to obtain the maternal aid of the Virgin.

By no means is there only one way to pray to obtain this aid. However, We consider the Holy Rosary the most convenient and adequate means, as is clearly suggested by the very origin of this practice and of its nature, more divine than human. What prayers are more adapted and more beautiful than the Lord's prayer and the angelic salutation, which are the flowers with which this mystical crown is formed? Adding to the vocal prayers the meditation on the Sacred Mysteries, there emerges another very great advantage,

that all, even the most simple and least educated, have in this a prompt and easy way to nourish and preserve their own faith.

And truly, from the frequent meditation on the Mysteries, the soul draws and imperceptibly absorbs the virtues they contain, and lights up with extraordinary hope of the immortal virtues, and becomes strongly and easily impelled to follow the path which Christ Himself and His Mother have followed. The recitation of identical formulas, repeated so many times, rather than rendering the prayer sterile and boring, has on the contrary the admirable quality of infusing confidence in him who prays and makes a sweet compulsion toward the maternal heart of Mary.

Endeavor with particular care, O Venerable Brethren, that the Faithful, on the occasion of the coming month of October, should perform this most fruitful form of prayer with the utmost possible zeal, and that the Holy Rosary become always more esteemed and more diligently recited. *Cont'd* →



OUR LADY OF THE HOLY ROSARY



~ with Commemoration of the 19th Sunday after Pentecost ~

Introit. Let us all rejoice in the Lord, keeping a feastday in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, for whose celebration the angels rejoice and unite in praising the Son of God. Ps. 44, 2. My heart hath uttered a good word: I speak my works to the King. V. Glory.

Prayer. O God, Whose only-begotten Son, by His life, death, and resurrection hath purchased for us the rewards of eternal life: grant, we beseech Thee, that, meditating on the mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise.

Prayer II. Almighty and merciful God, in Thy loving kindness do Thou keep us from all things that war against us, that, being unhampered alike in soul and in body, we may with free minds perform the works that are Thine. Through our Lord.

Lesson. Prov. 8, 22, 24, 32, 35. The Lord possessed me in the beginning of His ways, before He made anything, from the beginning, I was set up from eternity, and of old, before the earth was made. The depths were not as yet, and I was already conceived. Now, therefore, ye children, hear me: blessed are they that keep my ways. Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. Blessed is the man that heareth me, and that watcheth daily at my gates; and waiteth at the posts of my doors. He that shall find me, shall find life, and shall have salvation from the Lord.

Gradual. Ps. 44, 5, 11, 12. Because of truth, and meekness, and justice: and thy right hand shall conduct thee wonderfully. V. Hear, O daughter, and see, and incline thine ear; for the King hath desired thy beauty. Alleluia, alleluia. V. The solemnity of the glorious Virgin Mary, of the seed of Abraham, sprung from the tribe of Juda, of the noble line of David. Alleluia.

Gospel. Luke 1, 26-38. At that time: the angel Gabriel was sent from God into a city of Galilee, called Nazareth, to a virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. And the angel being come in, said unto her: Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women. Who having heard, was troubled at his saying, and thought with herself what manner of salutation this should be. And the angel said to her, Fear not, Mary, for thou hast found grace with God. Behold thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and shalt bring forth a son; and thou shalt call His name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God shall give unto Him the throne of David His father; and He shall reign in the house of Jacob forever. And of His kingdom there shall be no end. And Mary said to the angel, How shall this be done, because I know not man? And the angel answering said to her, The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Most High shall overshadow thee. And therefore also the Holy which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God. And behold thy cousin Elizabeth, she also hath

conceived a son in her old age; and this is the sixth month with her that is called barren; because no word shall be impossible with God. And Mary said: Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to thy word.

Offertory. Eccus. 24, 25, 39, 17. In me is all grace of the way and of the truth; in me is all hope of life and of virtue. Like a rose planted on the rivers I have borne fruit.

Secret. Grant us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to be fittingly prepared for the offering of these gifts, and, through the mysteries of the most holy Rosary, so to meditate upon the life, passion, and glory of Thine only-begotten Son, that we may become worthy of His promises. Who with Thee.

Secret II. Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that these gifts, which we offer up in the sight of Thy majesty, may be salutary unto us. Through our Lord.

Communion. Eccus. 39, 19. Send forth flowers, as the lily, and yield a smell, and bring forth leaves in grace, and praise with canticles, and bless the Lord in His works.

Postcommunion. May we be assisted, we beseech Thee, O Lord, by the prayers of Thy most holy Mother, whose Rosary we celebrate, that the virtue of the mysteries we adore may be shared and the effect of the sacraments we have received may be obtained. Who livest.

Postcommunion II. Let Thy healing power, O Lord, in mercy deliver us from our waywardness and cause us ever to cleave to Thy commandments. Through our Lord.

Last Gospel. Matt. 22, 2-14. At that time, Jesus spoke to the chief priests and the pharisees in parables, saying, The kingdom of heaven is likened to a king, who made a marriage for his son; and he sent his servants, to call them that were invited to the marriage, and they would not come. Again he sent other servants, saying, Tell them that were invited, Behold, I have prepared my dinner; my beeves and fatlings are killed, and all things are ready; come ye to the marriage. But they neglected: and went their ways, one to his farm, and another to his merchandise; and the rest laid hands on his servants, and having treated them contumeliously, put them to death. But when the king had heard of it, he was angry; and sending his armies, he destroyed those murderers, and burnt their city. Then he saith to his servants, The marriage indeed is ready, but they that were invited were not worthy. Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as you shall find, call to the marriage. And his servants going forth into the ways, gathered together all that they found, both bad and good; and the marriage was filled with guests. And the king went in to see the guests; and he saw there a man who had not on a wedding garment: and he saith to him, Friend, how comest thou in hither, not having on a wedding garment? but he was silent. Then the king said to the waiters, Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the exterior darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. For many are called, but few are chosen.
