Registration 2024-25

1st Communion : 2 years of class starting at age 5/6

Continuing Ed : Ages 7-9 who have received 1st Comm.

Confirmation : 2 years of class starting at age 9/10

Depending on their birthday, by June of their 2nd year of catechism, students must be at least 7 to receive First Holy Communion and 11 for Confirmation

Registration MUST be in person in the Church Basement Hall on one of the following dates:

August 10 @ 10:00am

August 17 @ 9:00am

August 24 @ 9:00am

Bring your children's Baptismal certificates & payment in cash or check due at time of registration (\$35 for 1st child, \$10 for each subsequent child)

Thought from St. Francis de Sales:

If our way of living and our senses, numbed at seeing and esteeming the world and this earthly life, make us feel quite foreign to spiritual things, let us amend this error in the light of faith. Only faith makes us consider those people happy who, in a brief time, have brought their voyage to an end. (Letters 852; O. XV)

THE TRANSFIGURATION

August 6

From St. Thomas Aquinas' *Summa Theologiae*

Our Lord, after foretelling His Passion to His disciples, had exhorted them to follow the path of His sufferings (*Mt 16*). Now in order that anyone go straight along a road, he must have some knowledge of the end: thus an archer will not shoot the arrow straight unless he first see the target. Hence Thomas said (*Jn 14:5*): "**Lord, we know not whither Thou goest; and how can we know the way?**" **Above all is this necessary when hard and rough is the road, heavy the going, but delightful the end.** Now by His Passion Christ achieved glory, not only of His soul, which He had from the first moment of His conception, but also of His body; according to Luke: "Christ ought to have suffered these things, and so to enter into His glory." To which glory He brings those who follow the footsteps of His Passion, according to Acts: "Through many tribulations we must enter into the kingdom of God." **It was fitting that He should show His disciples the glory of His clarity (which is to be transfigured), to which He will configure those who are His;** according to Phil 3:21: "Who will reform the body of our lowliness configured to the body of His glory." Hence Bede says on Mark 8:39: "By His loving foresight He allowed them to taste for a short time the contemplation of eternal joy, so that they might bear persecution bravely." **Christ wished to be transfigured in order to show men His glory, and to arouse men to a desire of it.**

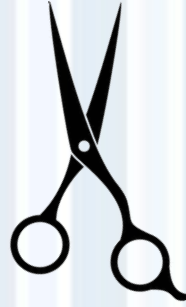

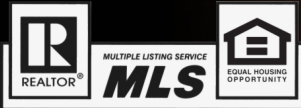

POST - COMMUNION PRAYER

WRITTEN BY ST. THOMAS AQUINAS

I give thanks to Thee, O Lord, Most Holy, Father almighty, eternal God, that Thou hast vouchsafed, for no merit of mine own, but out of Thy pure mercy, to appease the hunger of my soul with the precious Body and Blood of Thy Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ. Humbly I implore Thee, let not this Holy Communion be to me an increase of guilt unto my punishment, but an availing plea unto pardon and salvation. Let it be to me the armor of faith and the shield of good will. May it root out from my heart all vice; may it utterly subdue my evil passions and all my unruly desires. May it perfect me in charity and patience; in humility and obedience; and in all other virtues. May it be my sure defense against the snares laid for me by my enemies, visible and invisible. May it restrain and quiet all my evil impulses, and make me ever cleave to Thee Who art the one true God. May I owe to it a happy ending of my life. And do Thou, O heavenly Father, vouchsafe one day to call me, a sinner, to that ineffable banquet, where Thou, together with Thy Son and the Holy Ghost, art to Thy saints true light, complete fulfillment, eternal joy, consummate delight, and perfect happiness. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
