Brief History of the Blessing of Epiphany Water

With the commemoration of Christ's baptism there was associated in the Orient from ancient times not only the custom of blessing baptismal water in the churches but also of solemnly blessing a nearby river or fountain in honor of the Lord's baptism. In Palestine it was the Jordan that received this blessing in a solemn ceremony. Thousands of pilgrims would gather on its shores to step into the water after the rite, submerging three times to obtain the great blessing. In Egypt the Nile was thus blessed for many centuries. A similar tradition is found in the Byzantine Rite. In the cities of East Roman Empire, Epiphany water was blessed in the church and given to the people to take home. **In the Latin Church this blessing of water was introduced in the fifteenth century. The present rite of solemn blessing is to be performed on the vigil of Epiphany. The prayers, replacing older formulas, date from the year 1890.** The ceremony begins with a penitential act: the Litany of the Saints is sung kneeling, and two additional invocations are added to bless the water. Three psalms are then sung. Next, the celebrant pronounces a solemn exorcism over the water. Then the antiphon **Hodie caelesti Sponso** is sung with the Magnificat (or Benedictus if the ceremony is performed in the morning): "Today the church is joined to her heavenly Spouse, for Christ washed her offenses in the Jordan: the Magi hurried with gifts to the heavenly wedding-feast, and from water being made wine, the wedding-feast is made gladsome, alleluia." This antiphon, recounting the triple manifestation we celebrate, is also the Benedictus antiphon sung at Lauds on the morning of Epiphany and again on its Octave Day. Following the Gospel Canticle, the water blessing proper takes place: exorcism of salt and the confection and blessing of the water. All present are then sprinkled with the blessed water, and the ceremony finally concludes with the hymn of thanksgiving, the **Te Deum**. After the texts of the blessing the Roman Ritual gives the following instruction: "This blessed water should be distributed to the faithful, to be devoutly used by them in their homes, and also for the sick."

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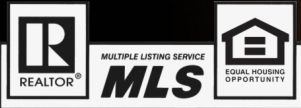

Epiphany House Blessing with Chalk

It has been a tradition in the Catholic Church to bless chalk on the Feast of Epiphany, and then use the blessed chalk as part of blessing homes in the New Year.

The home blessing can be done as follows:

Use the blessed chalk to write above the doorways:

20+C+M+B+XX

(Example: 20+C+M+B+25)

20XX for the year; C, M, B for Christus Mansionem Benedicat, Latin for “May Christ bless this house” and the 3 Wise Men – Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar.

As you are writing, pray one of the following prayers:

Lord God of heaven and earth, Thou hast revealed Thy only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Deign to bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our charity amongst ourselves and for others may reflect Thy love. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Lord our God, deign to bless this household. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and the keeping of Thy holy law. We give thanks to Thee, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, Who livest and reignest world without end. Amen.
