MASS INTENTIONS FOR 2023

If you wish to request any Masses for the next calendar year, please pay strict attention to these guidelines, which are intended to promote the common good and facilitate the very complicated work of scheduling. The pastor is morally bound to see to it that all our parishioners have the same opportunity to have Masses offered for their loved ones and personal intentions, which is the reason for the limitations explained below. Thank you for your cooperation in abiding by these norms.

- We are now accepting Mass intentions for 2023.
- For the time being, we are only able to accept Mass intentions from registered parishioners.
- In the first round of scheduling, there is a **strict limit of 10 (ten)** Mass intentions. If a greater number is submitted, all the requested intentions will be returned. After the new year, we will inform you in the bulletin if there are any remaining available spots for 2023.
- You may request specific dates, which will be accommodated to the extent possible, but we cannot make any promises about dates.
- It is not possible to reserve multiple Sundays.
- It is not possible to request a Mass by 'phone or e-mail. No Mass will be scheduled until the written request and accompanying Mass offering are received in the office. These may be submitted in the collection basket, by mail, or by coming in person to the office during office hours.
- Please make sure to use the **convenient forms** which are available by both entrances, in order to fill out your Mass requests.

ALL SAINTS CELEBRATION

On **Sunday, November 6**th (the Sunday after All Saints Day), the children of the parish are invited to participate in an "All Saints Parade" at the social hour after High Mass. Canon has to guess what saint you are! Parents who need some ideas may contact Mrs. Christina Watkins, who has some items that may be used and which may now be seen in the church hall. Please feel free to bring saint-themed refreshments to the reception!

What is "Mission Sunday"?

In 1926, Pope Pius XI designated the penultimate Sunday of October as "Mission Sunday." This is not a liturgical feast as such, but after the normal Orations (Collect, Secret, Postcommunion) of the occurring Sunday Mass, a commemoration is added from the Votive Mass for the Propagation of the Faith (see inset).

Collect: O God, who willest that all men should be saved and should come to the knowledge of the truth: we beseech Thee, send forth laborers into thy harvest, and grant them grace to speak Thy word with all boldness, so that Thy word may spread swiftly and be glorified, and all nations may know Thee, the only God, and Him whom Thou has sent: even Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord: who with Thee liveth and reigneth in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

Secret: Behold, O God, our Protector, and look upon the face of Thine Anointed, who gave Himself a redemption for us all, and grant that from the rising of the sun even to its going down, Thy name may be great among the Gentiles, and that in every place there may be sacrifice and a pure oblation offered to Thy name. Through the same, our Lord Jesus Christ, who with Thee liveth and reigneth in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

Postcommunion: Quickened by the redemptive gift, O Lord, we pray: that by this aid to eternal salvation the true faith may ever advance. Through Our Lord, etc.

In reviewing attentively the history of the Church, one cannot fail to notice how, from the first ages of Christianity, the especial care and solicitude of the Roman Pontiffs have been directed to the end that they, undeterred by difficulties and obstacles, might spread the light of the Gospel and the benefits of Christian culture and civilization to the peoples who "sat in darkness and in the shadow of death." The Church has no other reason for existence than, by developing the Kingdom of Christ on earth, to make mankind participate in the effects of His saving Redemption ... There is no need to insist how foreign it is to the virtue of charity, which embraces both God and men, for the members of Christ's Church not to think of those unfortunate souls who live in error outside the Fold ... Strive to have introduced and gradually to extend the pious custom of praying "the Lord of the harvest, that he send forth laborers into his harvest" and of asking for the heathen the light of the Holy Spirit and the grace of God.
