"Bring forth fruit with patience"


The parable of the sower is directed to each one of us, to you and me. We can examine ourselves on how we respond to the word of God, the Divine Seed.

St. Valentine, Priest & Martyr

Tuesday, February 14 - 6:00 p.m. Mass

St. Valentine of Rome (c. 270) was a priest who lived in Rome during the reign of Emperor Claudius II. Little is known of his life with certainty, except that he ministered to Christians who were persecuted and imprisoned for their faith, and died a martyr. One account has it that the emperor banned all marriages and engagements in Rome, believing this was the reason Roman men were unwilling to serve in the army. Valentine defied this unjust decree and continued to perform marriages for lovers in secret. He was arrested, and while in prison he restored sight to his jailer's blind daughter, causing the jailer and his entire extended household, forty-six people in total, to immediately convert to Christianity. Upon hearing this, Claudius ordered Valentine's execution. St. Valentine left a farewell note for the jailer's daughter, whom he had befriended, and signed it "From Your Valentine." He was beheaded on February 14th. St. Valentine is the patron of many causes including bee keepers, betrothed and engaged couples, lovers, love, happy marriages, and young people.

FEBRUARY - MONTH OF THE HOLY FAMILY

When the Holy Family left Egypt, they traveled back to Judea. Upon arrival they learned that the diabolically wicked Archelaus was in power and St. Joseph, every the watchful guardian of Jesus and Mary, was afraid to settle in the territory. Another angel visited him in a dream and with complete confidence in God, he withdrew into the region of Galilee.

So began the cloister of Christ's hidden life, in the land of Galilee. For the next eleven years, little is known about the home life of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Surely Mary wondered and pondered in her heart the prophetic visit of the Magi, and the prophecy of Simeon in the temple.



The Holy Family serves in many ways as the model for the practice of family virtues; one virtue to emulate in the family is humility. Humility can do much to smooth out the petty frictions and hypersensitivities that rise to the surface when human beings live close together for long periods of time. The example of divine humility -- the Son of God lowering Himself to learn the carpenter's skills from a human foster father, struggling to shape stubborn wood into useful bits of furniture -- should be enough to inspire all of us who go along for years doing menial, humdrum jobs without recognition or praise.

Another virtue perfectly mirrored in the Human Trinity is obedience, the virtue that inclines us to submit our will to lawful superiors, inasmuch as they are the representatives of God.

Obedience is also the foundation of family life, and in the natural order of things children must be obedient to their parents. Fathers should take St. Joseph as their ideal of the model father. Mary, is *par excellence* the model mother for all mothers, and children have as their pattern the child Jesus.




