Lent is approaching. Today, Jesus foresees that His disciples will be troubled, afraid, panicked at His Passion. He prepares them; He reassures them explaining to them the mystery of His Passion and death. The voices of the prophets had proclaimed the accomplishment of the tragedy of His Passion and the glory which should follow.

The disciples were regular people, not super humans. So Jesus tells them what lies ahead. They do not understand but Jesus enables them to see and understand later, when

His Passion and death take place. The Passion and Resurrection is the light that illuminates Holy Scripture, pointing to Christ. It is the singular event in human history that confirms and seals God's love for mankind, thereby allowing us to understand Scripture. With the disciples today, we discover this truth as if the scales have fallen from our eyes.

Today, we consider the power of faith with the strong example given by the blind beggar. But having access to God is not valuable, or having love, teaches St. Paul. We need nothing other than love. If we were to offer all that we are and all that we have to help the poor, it would pale into nothingness without love. Without love we are impoverished and have nothing at all. Simply put, with love we are wealthy and have all things.

What is Lent?

The word Lent translates to the more significant Latin term *quadragesima*, meaning "forty days". Lent recalls the forty days of Christ's fasting in the desert which He undertook after His baptism in the Jordon by St. John the Baptist.

Lent is a season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to worthily celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting.

We are more apt to acquiesce to the will of the Lord when we practice penances, but especially through deeper prayer and contemplation of all things sacred.

The giving of alms is not only a way to share God's gifts through the distribution of money, but also through the generous giving of our time and talents to worthy causes. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs."

Of course, we are all called not only to abstain from luxuries and even legitimate pastimes during Lent, but to a true conversion of heart in order to follow God's will more faithfully and with complete acceptance. By recalling the waters of redemption in our own baptisms, we can readily understand the call to be dead to sin and evil, and to begin a renewal in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Lenten Regulations

- 1. Ash Wednesday (February 22) & Good Friday (April 7) are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, only one full meal is allowed; with no solid food between meals. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs but they together should not equal another full meal
- 2. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat.
- 3. The obligation to abstain from meat commences at fourteen years of age.
- 4. The obligation to fast commences at eighteen years of age and ends at fifty-nine years of age.
- 5. Although the faithful enjoy freedom in conscience to excuse themselves for a just cause from these mitigated laws of fast and abstinence, the obligation to do penance is a serious one and **no Catholic should lightly excuse himself/herself from this obligation in Lenten Season.** Practices of Lenten penances and acts of mortification, increased devotion and prayer, and acts of mercy and charity, are worthy elements of our sincere preparation for Easter.


