Let us be witnesses.

The devil is real and we must be on our guard. The greatest achievement of the devil is that he has deceived so many into thinking that he does not exist! He is very happy to be thought of as a cute little red guy with catlike ears, a pointy tail, and matching pitchfork. Of course, he does exist, but deception is second nature to him, for he is the "Father of Lies."

Jesus tells us today, "He who is not with me is against me; and he who gathers not with me, scatters." It is good for us to receive such teaching, because one of the greatest errors of our time is the idea that "compromise" is always a good and virtuous thing. We are in the world but we are not of the world. We have to earn a living. We have to live in peace with our neighbor; these people around us may not be Catholic, but that must not change the nature of our faith, of our behavior, nor our responsibilities. If we must earn our living among pagans, that is not an excuse to be a pagan.

Nonetheless, all of our responsibilities in the world ought to be carried out with the intention of "having the Word of God and keeping it". We cannot keep the Commandments by only keeping a few of them; nor by keeping most of them; not even by keeping the most "popular" ones. The demands of truth and morality operate at all the levels of our society. As baptized Catholics, particularly if we have been confirmed, we have the duty to support objective truth and morality. Each of us has the duty to keep the Commandments, and sometimes we have an obligation to remind others of the same responsibilities - politely and tactfully, of course, but firmly.

Let us ask our Blessed Mother for the strength to be courageous witnesses of the Faith. She is indeed blessed because, by fidelity to the Word of God, she deflected the devil and cast him away from the world.

MARCH MONTH OF ST. JOSEPH

The Church traditionally dedicates the month of March to the special veneration of St. Joseph, whose feast day is March 19th. "He was chosen by the eternal Father as the trustworthy guardian and protector of his greatest treasures, namely, his divine Son and Mary, Joseph's wife," says St. Bernardine of Siena. "He carried out this vocation with complete fidelity until at last God called him, saying 'Good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your Lord." Due to St. Joseph's leadership of the Holy Family, he has been declared the protector and patron of the universal Catholic Church.





SAINT PATRICK Parton of the Oratory Friday, March 17 - 6:00 p.m. Mass

St. Patrick (387-493) was born in Kilpatrick. Scotland, to Roman-British parents. He was kidnapped by Irish raiders at the age of sixteen and sold as a slave to a Druid high priest. He worked as a shepherd and spent much time in prayer as he labored in the fields. He also acquired a perfect knowledge of the Celtic language and the Druid cult,

which later enabled him to evangelize the Celtic people. After six years of slavery, an angel told him to flee his oppressive master and return to his native land. Upon returning to Britain, Patrick desired to devote himself to God's service. He went to France and placed himself under the direction of St. Germain, who ordained him a priest and sent him to evangelize the pagans in Ireland. St. Patrick devoted the rest of his life to converting the island to Christianity. He was ordained a bishop and himself ordained many priests. He divided the country into dioceses, held local Church councils, founded monasteries, and urged the people to greater holiness. He suffered much opposition from the Druids and occult magicians, who, threatened by Christianity, conjured demonic power to defy Patrick. However, the prayer, faith, fearlessness, and episcopal authority of Patrick triumphed, and he was so successful in his endeavor that in the Middle Ages Ireland became known as the Land of Saints, and himself the "Apostle of Ireland." Later the missionaries sent from Ireland to Europe were largely responsible for the Christianizing of the continent. St. Patrick's feast day is March 17th.

Bishop David Ricken of Green Bay has given Catholics permission to eat meat on St. Patrick's Day as it honors, "one of the most successful Christian missionaries in history converting Ireland to Christianity." However, if you choose to eat meat on St. Patrick's Day, Bishop Ricken advises to perform a charitable or sacrificial act to make up


