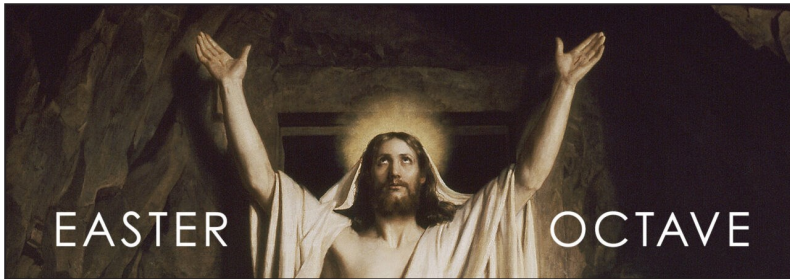

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY



About the Feast day "Divine Mercy Sunday", Jesus said "...tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon the souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet... Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy". (Diary 699)

The plenary indulgence is granted (under the usual conditions of a sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and a prayer for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on Divine Mercy Sunday, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, recite the *Our Father and the Creed, and add a devout prayer...* (e.g. *Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!*).

What is an "octave"?

And why have we celebrated one this week?

The Church knows that one day of rejoicing just isn't enough for such a liturgically important feast as The Resurrection of Our Lord.

Easter is the "Solemnity of Solemnities"—the holiest feast day of the year.

For her most important feast days, the Church assigns "octaves": eight days of rejoicing in which we celebrate each day as though it were the feast day itself.

The tradition of octaves goes back centuries, even to Old Testament where the custom of an Eight-day feast was common.

During the week after Easter and Pentecost, the newly baptized neophytes would continue to wear the white garments they received at their baptism, rejoicing for eight days in the joyful celebration of their new life in Christ. The Sunday after Easter is called "Dominica in Albis" to commemorate the laying aside of the white garments.

Octaves underwent many deletions over time; the octaves for Corpus Christie, the Chair of Unity, Epiphany, and others are no longer in the Church calendar. Today we keep three of them: Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost.

So, rejoice! As St. Paul would say: "Again, I say, rejoice!" (Philippians 4:4).

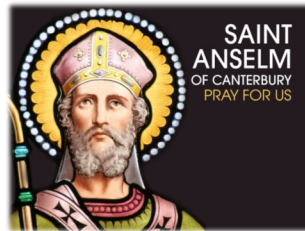
How long is the Easter season?

Much like Christmas, Easter is not a "one-day" feast.

We continue celebrating the Easter octave all through the week, but the season doesn't end there.

The season of Easter continues on for a full fifty days, up through the feast of Pentecost. Easter is the holiest feast in the liturgical calendar, and it only makes sense that the Church should celebrate not just a feast, not just an octave, but a whole *season* in honor of Our Lord's Resurrection.

Within these fifty days we celebrate some important feasts: St. Mark, Sts. Philip and James, the Feast of the Ascension, the Queenship of Mary and finally, Pentecost itself, the birthday of the Church!



St. Anselm of Canterbury Friday, April 21 - 6:00 p.m. Mass

St. Anselm (1033–1109) was born into a noble family in the Lombardy region of Italy. The example of his pious mother led him to great faith, and he sought to enter the monastery at age 15. However, the abbot refused him due to Anselm's stern father. After his mother's death Anselm left home and settled in Normandy to study under the direction of a famed monk named Lanfranc. Upon the death of his father, Anselm became a Benedictine monk at the age of 27. Due to his brilliance, Anselm became a teacher at the abbey's school and prior of the monastery. He went on to become the most learned theologian, philosopher, and mystic of his generation, the greatest since St. Augustine of Hippo. Anselm's fame led to his appointment as Archbishop of Canterbury in England, succeeding Lanfranc in this office, where he went on to correct abuses against the Church at the hand of the English kings. Twice he was banished from the island while appealing to Rome for assistance, and twice he returned to Canterbury to carry on his duties until his death. His abilities as an extraordinary theologian, negotiator, and statesman greatly supported the cause of the Church. As archbishop he continued his monastic lifestyle and intellectual pursuits. He composed several philosophical and theological treatises, as well as a series of beautiful prayers and meditations, which led him to be proclaimed a Doctor of the Church by Pope Clement XI in 1720. His feast day is celebrated on April 21st
