The first source of joy is God himself.

Joy is a gift from God, a fruit of the Holy Spirit, dwelling within us in sanctifying grace.

God gives us his joy when he gives us himself. Second, joy comes from the conviction that God loves us, that he gave his Son to save us, that he walks at our side always interceding for us. "If God is with us," St. Paul asked the Romans, "Who can be against us?"

Third, joy comes from a trust and hope in divine

providence, that everything works out for the good for those who love God.

This is what we see in the first disciples after the resurrection, when they were threatened by the same people who had crucified Jesus: Jesus' resurrection gave them courage and joy in the midst of persecution.

If we have the same trust in God's providence, the modern Sanhedrins and persecutors, sufferings and setbacks, won't be able to diminish our joy either. And fourth, joy comes from prayer, that we can approach God with anything we need, that he listens to us as a loving Father.

Among the causes of our joy is that we can ask God in prayer to increase our joy and make it complete.

Let's pray and take care of each other! Have a blessed Sunday!

The Invention of the Holy Cross

Wednesday, May 3 - 8:00 a.m. Mass The Holy Cross on which Our Lord was crucified was first discovered by Saint Helena in the year 326. A Roman emperor, Hadrian, about two hundred years before, in order to stop Christians from venerating the mount of Calvary where Jesus was crucified, had raised a large mound of earth over it and dedicated a temple there to the goddess Venus. When Saint Helena arrived in Jerusalem, with the help of Saint Macarius, Bishop of that city, she had the Temple of Venus destroyed. She hired two hundred workmen and one hundred soldiers to dig into the ground, and they found the

Holy Cross on which Our Lord was crucified. It was identified miraculously by the instantaneous cure of a little boy with a crippled arm and of a woman who was dying.

A large part of the Cross was placed in a church in Jerusalem. It was stolen in 615 by Chosroes, a king of the Persians. After many prayers and fasts, and a battle to recover it, the Emperor Heraclius defeated Chosroes and brought back the Holy Cross to Jerusalem, fourteen years after it was stolen. This was in the year 629. Part of the Cross was kept in Jerusalem, but a great part of it was brought to the Church of the Holy Cross of Jerusalem in Rome, one of the seven great churches of the Holy City.

Along with the finding of the True Cross, Saint Helena also found the nails which were in Jesus' hands and in His feet when He died and the inscription placed above the head of Jesus on the Cross, which proclaimed Him in Hebrew, in Greek, and in Latin: "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews." The nails are kept in churches in Europe. One of them is in the iron Crown of Lombardy. The spear which pierced Our Lord's side is kept in one of the pillars of the Vatican in Rome. The inscription over Our Lord's sacred head is kept in the Church of the Holy Cross of Jerusalem in Rome. There is a special feast dedicated to the nails and the spear that wounded Our Lord on the Cross, on the second Friday of every Lent.

MAY CROWNING & PROCESSION



Sunday, May 14

The May crowning will take place at 9:15 am and Immediately following (*weather permitting*) we will have a Rosary Procession around the St. Patrick's church neighborhood.

At 9:10 a.m. the children who will carry baskets of flower petals should meet in vestibule where someone will hand them their baskets and give them instructions.

May Crowning Rosary and song sheets will be available in the rear of the church for use during the procession.

Our crowned Lady will be carried throughout the entire procession.

The Procession is led by the Altar Servers with the processional Crucifix, followed by the children with baskets of flower petals to sprinkle on the way. Next in the procession will be the men carrying the statue of Our Blessed Mother.

The Ceremony concludes with the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Wishing you the blessings and protection of the Queen of Heaven and of the Most Holy Rosary.
