
#### **Canon Antoine Boucheron**

#### **ST. PHILIP NERI** PATRON OF THE INSTITUTE OF CHRIST THE KING SEMINARY

Friday, May 26 - 6:00 p.m. Mass

Born to a Florentine family in 1515, Philip was a cheerful, dutiful and docile child.

At the age of 16 he was sent to a cousin's to learn the family business and study. Although he excelled in his studies, he suddenly quit in order to spiritually serve the people of Rome. At that time, indifference, luxury, and corruption were widespread characteristics of the Roman clergy. Churches were neglected, flocks were abandoned, and the loss of faith was widespread. St. Philip Neri, with his commitment to a life of asceticism, was a contradiction to all of this malaise. In obedience to his spiritual director he finally became a priest at the age of 34.



Philip had a knack for starting up conversations and leading his listeners to consider a new and better way of life. He easily caught others' attention with his warm personality and incredible sense of humor. In short, Philip was an evangelist. He loved to share the Gospel and help people to find or rediscover their faith in Jesus Christ. His days were dedicated to helping others, but his nights were set aside for praying in the church or in the catacombs.

In 1544, on the eve of Pentecost, Philip saw what appeared to be a globe of fire. It is said the fire entered his mouth, causing him to feel his heart dilate. Philip was filled with such paroxysms of divine love that caused him to scream out, "Enough, enough, Lord, I can bear no more." Philip then discovered a swelling in his chest, though it caused him no pain. The cause of this swelling was discovered by the doctors who examined his body after death. The saint's heart had been dilated under the sudden impulse of love, and in order that it might have sufficient room to move, two ribs had been broken, and curved in the form of an arch. From the time of the miracle till his death, his heart would palpitate violently whenever he performed spiritual actions.

He started a religious order known simply as "The Oratory" for laymen to gather together and practice greater spiritual discipline, which grew and became famous. So great was the fervor of his charity, that, instead of recollecting himself before Mass, he had to use deliberate means of distraction in order to attend to the external rite. And so intense was his recollection that during the last five years of his life he had permission to celebrate privately in a little chapel close to his room. At the *Agnus Dei* the server went out, locked the doors, and hung up a notice: "Silence, the Father is saying Mass". When he returned in two hours or more, the saint was so absorbed in God that he seemed to be at the point of death, but his face shone with a celestial glow.

He is the patron of Rome and the U.S. Army Special Forces, humor and joy. His feast day is May 26.

St. Philip Neri is also the Patron of the Seminary of the Institute of Christ the King and is its name sake. St. Phillip Neri Seminary located in an ancient chateau at Gricigliano in Tuscany, is where seminarians receive the formation that prepares them to serve the Sovereign Priest after ordination.


