How do you offer a Mass for someone?



We see in the church Bulletin, "This Mass is being offered for the intentions of [someone]." What does this mean, and how do we offer a Mass for a friend, a family member or the deceased?

The Mass is the most powerful of all prayers, so it is a very effective way to pray for loved ones. Praying for loved ones through the Mass is an ancient tradition. While you can personally offer your prayers at Mass for a special intention, requesting that a priest say a Mass for your intention can be even more powerful because the priest himself has offered the Mass for that intention.

You can offer a Mass for family members, friends, or any special intention, but Masses offered for the dead are particularly powerful. In fact, many souls have actually appeared to loved ones to ask for Masses to be said for them so that they will be released from Purgatory. Since the souls in Purgatory are no longer able to pray for themselves, they rely on the prayers and good works of those still on earth to help them enter heaven sooner. Jesus loves them so much that He will often release a soul sooner when such prayers as the Mass are offered.

When you request a Mass for a special intention it is customary to give a very small monetary gift, called a Stipend, in the Diocese of Green Bay the customary amount is \$10, if you cannot afford that amount any offering is accepted.

Requesting a Mass for your special intention is easier than you might thinkTo have a Mass offered, Please <u>print</u> names legibly on a slip of paper, Include the intention of the Mass and who it is offered by if you choose.

Insert it in an envelope and indicate "Attn: Mass stipend". You may place it in the normal weekly collection basket or mail it to the Rectory (Please make checks payable to: ICKSP Green Bay). Please limit your requests to 10 per family per year. For emergencies (i.g. a loved one who just passed away) call Canon Boucheron.

Nativity of John the Baptist

Saturday, June 24 - 9:00 a.m. Mass

A family relation of Jesus, St. John the Baptist is called "the Forerunner" because he was sent by God to "prepare the way of the Lord" ahead of Jesus' public ministry. The birth of St. John the Baptist to his elderly and previously barren parents, Zechariah and Elizabeth, is recorded in St. Luke's Gospel. His birth was announced to his father Zechariah by the Archangel Gabriel, who also brought the news of Christ's birth to the Blessed Virgin Mary. John the Baptist's nativity is one of only three birthdays celebrated by the Church, along with the nativities of Jesus and Mary. Though not an official dogma, according to ancient tradition St. John the Baptist was freed from original sin at the

moment his mother heard the greeting of the Blessed Virgin at the Visitation, causing John to leap in his mother's womb through the action of the Holy Spirit. So, like Jesus and Mary, St. John would have been born without sin, and therefore his birthday is also worthy of special honor. Because Christ praised John the Baptist so highly by saying "Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist," he was one of the most highly venerated saints in the ancient and medieval Church. He has two feasts: his nativity on June 24th and his passion on August 29th.
