The Precious Blood of Jesus is a clear example of the parts of our faith that seem completely simple, and yet if we spend any time contemplating them, we soon find ourselves swimming in very deep waters indeed.

The blood is the life, and the life is in the blood. So said ancient Israel; this is why, according to the kosher laws, slaughtered animals must have the blood completely drained.

In God, life ("I am who am") and love are one and the same. To be, for Him, is to love. He is relationship. He is love. He is endless giving and receiving, the Beginning and the End. He is an endless dance.

All our relationships here below are some small imitation, some pale shadow, of the three eternal persons who are one God. We resemble them; they do not resemble us. The higher does not resemble the lower; the lower resembles the higher.

And yet — and yet, the Son became man. God became one of us. Spirit took on flesh. The higher went lower.

This was incomprehensible to the devil and his angels, and so they fell. This is a mystery to the holy angels, and so they praise God for His infinite mercy, His infinite mystery, and before the greatest of mysteries, are silent.

And one of the greatest mysteries is that we become members of the Body of Christ, grafted branches on the Vine descending from Heaven. We share in the life, the sap of God, in His divinity by way of His humanity.

Saint Faustina talked about the consequences of this, that the human heart has become a home for God, as it had been intended to be from the foundation of the world.

O Blessed Host, take up Your dwelling within my soul, O Thou my heart's purest love!

With Your brilliance the darkness dispel. Refuse not Your grace to a humble heart.

O Blessed Host, enchantment of all heaven,

Though Your beauty be veiled And captured in a crumb of bread,

Strong faith tears away that veil (Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, 159).

This month of the Precious Blood, let's spend some time contemplating the mystery of the Eucharist. Let's ponder how the life and love of God is transmitted to us under the appearances of bread and wine, and how the fire from outside of time is introduced into our hearts, into our very bodies. We share in God's grace, God's own existence, through the generosity of the Almighty. Let's not take that gift for granted.

Saint Vincent de Paul

The deathbed confession of a dying servant opened Vincent de Paul's eyes to the crying spiritual needs of the peasantry of France. This seems to have been a crucial moment in the life of the man from a small farm in Gascony, France, who had become a priest with little more ambition than to have a comfortable life.

The Countess de Gondi—whose servant he had helped—persuaded her husband to endow and support a group of able and zealous missionaries who would work among poor tenant farmers and country people in general. Vincent was too humble to accept leadership at first, but after working for some time in Paris among imprisoned galley slaves, he returned to be the leader of what is now known as the Congregation of the Mission, or the Vincentians. These priests, with vows of poverty, chastity, obedience, and stability, were to devote themselves entirely to the people in smaller towns and villages.

Later, Vincent established confraternities of charity for the spiritual and physical relief of the poor and sick of each parish. From these, with the help of Saint Louise de Marillac, came the Daughters of Charity, "whose convent is the sickroom, whose chapel is the parish church, whose cloister is the streets of the city." He organized the rich women of Paris to collect funds for his missionary projects, founded several hospitals, collected relief funds for the victims of war, and ransomed over 1,200 galley slaves from North Africa. He was zealous in conducting retreats for clergy at a time when there was great laxity, abuse and ignorance among them. He was a pioneer in clerical training and was instrumental in establishing seminaries.

Most remarkably, Vincent was by temperament a very irascible person—even his friends admitted it. He said that except for the grace of God he would have been "hard and repulsive, rough and cross." But he became a tender and affectionate man, very sensitive to the needs of others.


