The Church dedicates the month of August to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It is a dogma of the Catholic faith that Mary is the Immaculate Conception; that is, in preparation for the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Holy Trinity in her womb, she was conceived without the corruption of sin through the foreseen and infinite merits of her Son, Jesus Christ. Over the centuries, as saints and theologians reflected on how Mary pondered and treasured the sacred events from the life of Christ in her holy heart, as attested in Scripture, her pure heart was recognized as something to be imitated. Devotion to Our Lady's purity of heart began to flower—so much so that in the 17th century, St. John Eudes promoted it alongside the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The devotion rose to a new level after the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima, when Mary revealed an image of her Immaculate Heart to Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco.



## **August 8 - 6:00 p.m. Mass**

St. John Vianney, also known as St. Jean Marie Vianney (1786–1859) was born in France to a farming family, one of six children of devout Catholic parents. He was baptized on the day of his birth. When he was four years old the French Revolution erupted, and priests were forced into hiding. Every day they risked their lives to give the sacraments, and John looked up to them as heroes. His First Holy Communion and Confirmation were made in secrecy. After the Church in France was reestablished, John studied for the priesthood. He had difficulty in his studies due to his lack of formal education during the turmoil of the revolution, but his great desire carried him through. After his ordination he became a parish priest assigned to the small country town of Ars. There he ministered to the carnage the revolution had left in the souls of the French people. Many were indifferent to, and ignorant of, the Faith. John performed great penances for the people and received many graces for their conversion. He had the gifts of miracle-working, prophecy, hidden knowledge, and discernment of spirits. He was soon known internationally, and people came from afar to see him. Year after year he spent 11-12 hours a day in the confessional, and up to 16 hours in the summer. By 1855 there were 20,000 pilgrims traveling annually to Ars. Because of this St. John Vianney was tormented by evil spirits throughout his life, especially when he attempted to get his two to three hours of sleep a night. He died at the age of 73 after serving 40 years as a parish priest. Over 300 priests and 6,000 people attended his funeral. St. John Vianney is the patron saint of confessors and priests.

# Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest Living the Truth in Charity

Dear Faithful,

I am very excited to announce a new group pilgrimage, taking place in 2024 with the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest. Our friends at St. Charles Catholic Pilgrimages have organized an extraordinary two-part exploration of France to be led by our own **Canon Benoît Jayr** of St. Stanislaus Oratory in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. All members of our Institute family are invited to take advantage of one or both pilgrimage opportunities.

In the first pilgrimage opportunity, from May 15–20, pilgrims will participate in the **historic Chartres Pentecost Pilgrimage**. This walking pilgrimage is the largest annual traditional Catholic event in the world today, drawing more than 16,000 participants from all across the globe. Pilgrims set out on a three-day trek (with two nights camping), walking from the Church of Saint-Sulpice in Paris to Notre-Dame in Chartres.

In the second pilgrimage, from May 20–31, pilgrims will embark on a 12-day, faith-inspiring tour of the major shrines of France, beginning in Vers sur Launette near Paris with Holy Mass in the private chapel of the Institute's Sister Adorers of the Royal Heart of Jesus and concluding with a celebration dinner at Canon Jayr's family farm near Montauban in southwestern France. Highlights include:

- Daily Latin Mass with Canon Jayr
- Special visit to Le Barroux Abbey for sung High Mass
- Opportunities to pray in the presence of incorrupt saints such as St. Catherine Labouré, St. Vincent de Paul, St. Bernadette, and St. John Vianney
- A full day in Lourdes with a visit to the miraculous baths
- Visit to the tomb of St. Martin of Tours
- Visit to the Holy Face Oratory in Tours
- Mass at the Institute chapel in Toulouse
- Visit to Carcassonne Castle with time for shopping
- Visit to the tomb of St. Thomas Aguinas
- Dinner in Avignon, served with local wine
- Visit and dinner at the family farm of Canon Jayr
