The parable that our Lord recounts today ought to give us reason to stop and think about our own spiritual life.

Of course, He is not talking about the proper etiquette for attending weddings and other big parties. Rather, He is talking about the conscious and unconscious decisions we all make about our relationship with God.

That's why our Lord gives us this parable today: so that we might make an examination of conscience. Have I been away for too long from Confession or Communion?

Have I allowed the fire of charity to grow cold, neither loving God nor my fellow man? Have I tried to look like a Christian on the outside, yet remaining a pagan on the inside? Have I avoided conversation with God in prayer? Have I tried to hide the truth with excuses?

Questions like these may well be some of the most important we can ever ask ourselves. For the Kingdom of Heaven is like this very wedding feast. Even though we have accepted God's invitation for salvation, we will still be judged on the way we conduct ourselves in this life. We don't want to have come this far only "to be cast into the exterior darkness." So let's make that examination of conscience, and make changes where they are necessary. Let's make sure that our Lord wasn't talking about us when He said those ominous words:

"Many are called, but few are chosen."

OCTOBER - THE MONTH OF HOLY ROSARY

The Catholic Church designates October as the Month of the Holy Rosary.

During this month the faithful venerate the Blessed Virgin Mary especially under her title of Our Lady of the Rosary, and make special effort to honor the Holy Rosary with group recitations and rosary processions.

St. Dominic de Guzman, the founder of the Order of Preachers, is the saint to whom Our Lady famously appeared and gave the prayers of the Holy Rosary to assist him as a spiritual weapon in combating heresy and leading souls back to the one, true Catholic faith.

Since the time of Saint Dominic, the Most Holy Rosary has been the weapon by which Our Lady has brought about the greatest victories for the Church. On many occasions when all seemed lost humanly speaking, this act of trust in Our Lady has transformed what appears to be certain failure into glorious triumph. The heroic conviction displayed by Catholics of generations past and present shows Our Lady's power and certain intercession in overcoming the greatest obstacles.

Will Our Lady grant a victory to Catholics in the twenty-first century as she has in the past? As Catholics of previous generations have testified, trusting in the certain victory of the Immaculate Heart of Mary through the Rosary can defeat the forces of evil and change the course of history.

Feast Of The Maternity Of The Blessed Virgin Mary Wednesday, October 11 - 9:00 a.m. Mass

October 11th is the Feast of the Maternity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, honouring her role as Theotokos (or Mother of God), as affirmed at the Council of Ephesus.

The object of this feast is to commemorate the dignity of the Mary as Mother of God. Mary is truly the Mother of Christ, who in one person unites the human and divine nature. This title was solemnly ratified by the Council of Ephesus, 22 June, 431. The hymns used in the office of the feast also allude to Mary's dignity as the spiritual mother of men. The love of Mary for all mankind was that of a mother, for she shared all the feelings of her son whose love for men led Him to die for our redemption (Hunter, Dogm.Theo. 2, 578).
