St. Raphael The Archangel Tuesday, October 24 - 6:00 p.m. Mass

St. Raphael is one of the seven Archangels who stand before the throne of the Lord, and one of the only three mentioned by name in the Bible. He appears, by name, only in the Book of Tobias. Raphael's name means "God heals." This identity came about because of the biblical story that claims he "healed" the earth when it was defiled by the sins of the fallen angels in the apocryphal book of Enoch.

Disguised as a human in the Book of Tobias, Raphael refers to himself as "Azarias the son of the great Ananias" and travels alongside Tobit's son, Tobias. Once Raphael returns from his journey with Tobias, he declares to Tobit that he was sent by the Lord to heal his blindness and deliver Sarah, Tobias's future wife, from the demon Asmodeus. It is then that his true healing powers are revealed and he makes himself known as "the angel Raphael, one of the seven, who stand before the Lord" Tobias 12:15.

The demon Asmodeus killed every man Sarah married on the night of the wedding, before the marriage could be consummated. Raphael guided Tobias and taught him how to safely enter the marriage with Sarah.

Raphael is credited with driving the evil spirit from Sarah and restoring Tobit's vision, allowing him to see the light of Heaven and for receiving all good things through his intercession.

Although only the archangels Gabriel and Michael are mentioned by name in the New Testament, the Gospel of John speaks of the pool at Bethesda, where many ill people rested,

awaiting the moving of the water. "An angel of the Lord descended at certain times into the pond; and the water was moved. And he that went down first into the pond after the motion of the water was made whole of whatsoever infirmity he lay under" John 5:1-4. Because of the healing powers often linked to Raphael, the angel spoken of is generally associated with St. Raphael, the Archangel.

St. Raphael is the patron saint of travelers, the blind, bodily ills, happy meetings, nurses, physicians and medical workers. He is often pictured holding a staff and either holding or standing on a fish.

ORATORY NOTES REGARDING THE ASPERGES ME AND PROCESSION

Two things that have been noticed recently and need some clarification:

Firstly, for the Asperges before High Mass, it is incorrect to genuflect when you are sprinkled with Holy Water. You are simply being blessed with Holy Water. All that is needed is to make the Sign of the Cross.

Secondly, when the priest processes in and when he leaves there is no need to bow to him. The only time it is appropriate to bow/genuflect is if the celebrant were a Bishop.

These two things may seem very small, and they likely come from a place of reverence and piety, but they are not fitting for the procession and Asperges. The Liturgy of the Latin Mass is very beautiful but exact.

This fraternal correction is given with charity and should be received with charity.






