Passion Sunday?

This Sunday is called "Passion Sunday" because during the next two weeks before Easter, the Liturgy concentrates on the sufferings and death of Jesus to atone for our sins.

Doing so, Jesus has given meaning to human suffering, He has made it meritorious if accepted for the love of God and offered up for the salvation of the world.

Jesus is the innocent victim, and He attains the high point of His mission into the world when it is His hour for which He longed. This SHOULD be an opportunity to meditate about suffering, the Cross, the meaning of life, the human weakness. It is important because our world requires the objective ZERO DEFECT, the superman as suggested to Eve by the devil.

However, our fragility makes us strong. Dealing with it, we understand how much great family life is, how much we need to take care of each other.

As we look at Jesus on the cross we confront the mystery of suffering and death and the paradox that suffering with Jesus leads to glory and happiness. Our task now is to follow Him during Holy Week. He says, "If you wish to be my disciple, take up your cross daily and follow me." These words are addressed to you and me. In the Acts of the Apostles (5:41) it is said that the Apostles rejoiced that they could suffer something for Jesus. They found joy in their sufferings because they saw meaning in it. They were sharing in the sufferings of Christ and had hope of eternal salvation. So during this Passiontide let us imitate them!




Holy Week Liturgy Announcement

In 2018 permission was received from the Pontifical Commission *Ecclesia Dei* in Rome to celebrate the Liturgy of Holy Week according to the liturgical norms in use before changes were made mid-20th century. All the apostolates of the Institute of Christ the King are included with other *Ecclesia Dei* communities in this indult.

This older form of the Ritual and its prayers offer a spirituality that is especially rich and edifying in total conformity with the spirit of the Roman Missal.

For the benefit of the faithful, booklets with English translations and explanations are available at the entrance to the church. These booklets will be used on Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil.

SAINT JOSEPH

Spouse of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary & Patron of the Universal Church Tuesday, March 19 - 6:00 p.m. Mass

St. Joseph (1st c.) was a descendant of Israel's King David and a carpenter by trade.

Scripture tells us that he was a just and virtuous man who was betrothed to wed the young Blessed Virgin Mary. Upon finding her expecting a child that was the Son of God, Joseph, after a time of uncertainty, was encouraged by an angel to continue with the espousal plans. Because of his complete faithfulness and obedience to the will of God, St. Joseph was chosen to become the spouse of the Mother of God and the adoptive father of Jesus Christ. As the divinely-appointed earthly guardian and protector of the Holy Family, St. Joseph provided and cared for the material needs of Mary and the Child Jesus. St. Joseph is the patron saint of many causes, especially fathers, families, married couples, children, pregnant women, workers, craftsmen, against doubt, the dying, and a happy and holy death. He is also the guardian and protector of the Universal Church. He has two feast days: St. Joseph the Husband of Mary on March 19, and St. Joseph the Worker on May 1.


