**“Blessed is He who comes, the king, in the name of the Lord.”**

They follow this with an acclamation that recalls the message of the angels at Christmas, but they modify it in a way that gives pause. The angels had spoken of the glory of God in the highest heavens and of peace on earth for men of divine goodwill. The pilgrims at the entrance to the Holy City say: “Peace in heaven and glory in the highest heavens!” They know well that there is no peace on earth. And they know that the place of peace is in heaven. Thus this acclamation is an expression of a profound suffering and it is also a prayer of hope: May He who comes in the name of the Lord bring to earth what is in heaven.



This acclamation greets Jesus as the King who, coming from God, enters in our midst in God's name.

Today too, this joyous greeting is always supplication and hope. Let us pray to the Lord that He bring heaven to us: God's glory and peace among men. We understand such a greeting in the spirit of the request of the Our Father: “Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven!” We know that heaven is heaven, a place of glory and peace, because there the will of God rules completely. And we know that earth is not heaven until the will of God is accomplished on it. So we greet Jesus, who comes from heaven and we pray to Him to help us know and do God's will. May the royalty of God enter into the world and in this way be it filled with the splendor of peace.

# Holy Week Liturgy Announcement

In 2018 permission was received from the Pontifical Commission *Ecclesia Dei* in Rome to celebrate the Liturgy of Holy Week according to the liturgical norms in use before changes were made mid-20th century. All the apostolates of the Institute of Christ the King are included with other *Ecclesia Dei* communities in this indult.

This older form of the Ritual and its prayers offer a spirituality that is especially rich and edifying in total conformity with the spirit of the Roman Missal.

For the benefit of the faithful, booklets with English translations and explanations are available at the entrance to the church. These booklets will be used on Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil.

## Could you not watch one hour with Me?

During the Sacred Triduum opportunities exist for the faithful to console Jesus and His afflicted mother in honor of their intense sufferings. **Immediately after the Maundy Thursday Mass and the stripping of the altar, Adoration will take place at the Altar of Repose until midnight.**

Together we can console our Jesus and His Sorrowful Mother through the entire Sacred Triduum.

## Second Sunday in Passiontide

### Palm Sunday

*Hosanna to the son of David!*

*Blessed is He who comes in the Name of the Lord!*

Following the Jews' example on Palm Sunday, we proclaim Christ as Victor -- He is the Messiah, the Son of David and the Son of God. He is the sign of contradiction, acclaimed by some and reviled by others, sent into this world to wrest us from sin and the power of Satan. He underwent His Passion, the punishment for our sins, but issues forth triumphant from the tomb, the victor over death, making our peace with God and taking us with Him into the kingdom of His Father in heaven.

The predominant theme of Palm Sunday is the account of our Lord's Passion. Christ's triumph was preceded by His humiliation "even to the death of the Cross." St. Paul lays particular emphasis on our Lord's voluntary humiliation which was the condition of His exaltation and our redemption. While His great example is a reminder of what we owe to His sufferings, it should also teach us that only if we are "instructed by His patience," and the other lessons of the Passion may we "share in His resurrection."

As of old on Sinai the blood of the victims sealed the covenant of God with His people, so on the cross the Blood of the perfect Victim, Jesus Christ, will seal the new covenant between God and man, as it was foretold by the prophets. St. Matthew's account of The Passion emphasizes the fulfillment of the Scriptures; the whole somber tragedy takes place according to the divine plan; the prophecies are fulfilled, Jesus is the promised Messias.
