

# MAKE FRIENDS IN HEAVEN

Whenever you gain a plenary indulgence, one of the poor souls in Purgatory is released to Heaven. A plenary indulgence removes the temporal punishment for forgiven sins. By your indulgenced actions you have tapped into the treasury of satisfaction won by Jesus and the saints. This is a very good way to make a friend in Heaven, who will then pray for you.

The actions which can merit a plenary indulgence include reciting a 5 decade Rosary in church, with devout meditation on the mysteries. At St. Stanislaus, we have the opportunity to do this before every Mass.

There are specific requirements for gaining a plenary indulgence. These are called "the usual conditions" and are spelled out in a pamphlet in the north pamphlet rack.

# Proper Attire in Church

Now that the warm summer weather is here, we kindly remind you about the importance of coming to church decently attired. Although it can be tempting to dress with comfort primarily in mind, out of respect for God's house and out of consideration for the dignity of the human person, it is important to dress with modesty and decorum. Revealing or tight-fitting clothing does not meet the norms for Christian modesty, especially in church. Gentlemen are kindly asked not to wear shorts. No exposed backs or shoulders. Ladies and girls should wear skirts and dresses falling at least below the knee and are encouraged to have their heads covered, in keeping with apostolic tradition.

# TMENTS

early Church, the arel worn now at st were part of ordinary clothing. Over the centuries, fashions changed but the vestments did not. This is symbolic of the continuity of the Church.

The first item the priest puts on is the AMICE. This is a rectangular piece of white linen with tie straps. It is a symbol of the helmet of salvation, as mentioned in 1 Thessalonians.

Originally, the priest kept in on his head to protect against the cold. Now, he may put it on head but slide it down around his neck. As a practical matter, the amice serves to protect the rest of his vestments from perspiration.
