Dear Faithful,

During the scheduled bell maintenance program it became evident the clappers of each of the four large bells in the towers were in need of special attention. The clappers are a long iron rod with a ball at the end. The clapper hangs in the center of the bell and as the bell swings the ball of the clapper strikes the walls of the bell making the bell ring. Over the past 151 years the balls at the end of the clapper have become worn and flat. The result being a diminished tone and volume. Therefore the clappers in each bell have been replaced. The bells now ring out as they did when they were first installed. So, when you exit church after Mass listen and you will hear the different tones of each bell at increased volume letting the neighborhood know St Stanislaus is alive and lifting our voices through the church bells. The original clappers are displayed in the courtyard of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

ST. PETER IN CHAINS

Tuesday, August 1st, is the feast day of St. Peter in Chains. He is represented in our church in the medallion above the sanctuary, on the left.

The feast of St. Peter in Chains honors the fact that St. Peter was imprisoned both in Jerusalem and in Rome. His chains from both imprisonments are enclosed in a large reliquary in Rome in the church of San Pietro in Vincoli. In the 5th Century, when Pope Leo I placed the chains in this reliquary, they were miraculously joined together.

Portiuncula Indulgence

Wednesday, August 2nd, is the annual occurrence of the Portiuncula Indulgence, or the Pardon of Assisi. The name comes from the little chapel which was restored by St. Francis in 1209. Our Lord appeared to St. Francis in that chapel in 1216 and told him to ask the Pope to grant a plenary indulgence for those who visit that chapel. This was granted by Pope Honorius III.

Over the years, the Portiuncula Indulgence has been expanded to apply to anyone saying certain required prayers in any church, under the usual conditions. The required prayers are six Our Fathers, six Hail Marys and six Glorias for the Pope's intentions.
