

Liturgical Calendar: What is the Difference between a Sunday After Pentecost in the Traditional Calendar and an Ordinary Sunday in the Novus Ordo Calendar? For most of Church history, until the establishment of the new liturgical calendar in 1970, there was no "Ordinary Time" in the Catholic calendar. Rather, we celebrated what were called the weeks after Epiphany and the weeks after Pentecost, the two major solemnities that closed out the Christmas and Easter seasons, respectively. In the Novus Ordo calendar, all of these weeks were grouped together and called "Ordinary Time". Here, "ordinary" does not mean what it usually means in English, that is, "commonplace, or standard"; instead, it refers to the counting of weeks in

"ordinal" numbers, which number items in a series, such as "first, second' third" etc. In the official Latin, this time is referred to as tempus per annum, or "time through the year".

Because the date of Easter varies from year to year, and since there are only fifty-two weeks in the year, the lengths of the time after Epiphany and the time after Pentecost will vary from year to year. In the Novus Ordo, these are all numbered starting with what we would call "Weeks after Epiphany" and continue on after Pentecost. This is why you will observe a difference in the week number between the two rites beginning after Pentecost, although there is really no difference in the total number of Sundays.


